Ucas points essentially translate your qualifications into a numerical score, allowing students greater flexibility in how they qualify to study their chosen course. Beyond establishing admissions criteria, the scores are used by universities to report data to Government bodies. However, Ucas also advises that not all qualifications are included, for example. Students studying Btecs are given one, two or three grades, depending on the size of their course.
