



FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP

The month of October was a "bummer" for the Operating account at Windsor.

- Total Income was \$8,800 below budget
- Total Expenses were \$700 lower than budget
- Net Income was \$8,100 under budget.

Income was lower, mainly due to General Contributions being much lower than normal. Expenses were, once again, well in hand as almost all categories were lower than budgeted.

Windsor's Operating Fund remains in good condition for the ten months, year-to-date, as Total Income for that period is almost the same amount as last year while Total Expenses are almost \$12,000 below the total for last year.

Parking Lot Task Force Update

There is continuing good news on this front (albeit as slow as molasses in January). After receiving the good news from the City of Windsor Heights that the project has received the go-ahead, our civil engineer, Shane Devick, has contacted three different construction companies for bids on the parking lot construction. Needless to say, your prayers are essential so that we might make further progress on this project so that we are not hindered by possible changes in the weather.

Hello!! While others are starting to hibernate, we are still going strong at WPC. Thanks to everyone who contributed to the special offering for The Little Food Pantries. We raised some much needed funds to support us through the winter months. Please keep the item




We are also signed up for Salvation
