

Lent—The Good Shepherd

Ash Wednesday, February 18, invites us to a Lenten fast. Lent is a season of reflection, renewal, and hope. We receive the ashes and are reminded of the gift of life and our own finitude. Knowing that our lives will not continue forever opens the way for us to share our love and engage in things that truly matter.

This year as we journey with Jesus in the gospel of John, Jesus calls himself the Good Shepherd who lays down his life for his sheep. We will watch as Jesus prepares to do just that. The stories will take us from the tomb of Lazarus, through the week of Passover, to the foot of the cross.

I encourage you to read the gospel of John's beautiful and heart-rending telling of Christ's passion. Reading the whole gospel is a gift. Read and re-read the texts for the Sundays, but also the stories in between, so you can have a full picture of who Jesus is. The gospel writer is clear—these stories have been written so that we may believe in him and believing may have life. We are invited to walk with the Good Shepherd to the cross even as we place our hope in his triumph over the powers of darkness and death.

The **December Operating Statement** showed that it was a great way for us to end the year. Net Income was \$4,700. Total Income was \$12,500 over budget as we received four large gifts totaling \$22,000. Contributions were \$14,100 in excess of budget. Total Expenses were \$7,800 over budget as there were some extra ordinary items that needed to be paid before year-end. We purchased drums for worship at a cost of \$2,900, remitted previously collected denominational offerings to Presbytery amounting to \$4,100 and paid an excess amount of \$1,950 for snow removal due to the 18+ inches of snow received during the month. We ended the year with a cash balance of over \$14,000 and a total Net Loss of \$900 for the 12 months.

Three opportunities for learning, conversation, and community start up again in 2026.

Presbyterian Women meet on the third Saturday of each month at 10:00 in Ward Hall. Our PW Bible study is called, "Finding Resilience, Joy, and Our Identity in Jesus Christ". Everyone is welcome, and we hope you will take advantage of these occasions to join with your Windsor family and to strengthen your commitment to love and serve the Lord.



SPECIAL OFFERINGS

Change is coming to the **Special Offerings** through the Presbyterian Church. The Pentecost and Peace and Global Witness Offerings have been discontinued as of the end of 2025. These were both offerings in which the churches kept a portion of the donation to fund local projects they were working on.

Starting in 2026, there will be three special offerings instead of four.

- One Great Hour of Sharing (February 18–April 5),
- World Communion Offering (September 6 through October 4), and
- Christmas Joy Offering (November 29–December 20).



One Great Hour of Sharing

One Great Hour of Sharing remains largely the same as in previous years. It addresses hunger, disaster relief, poverty, climate change, immigration, and refugees. It serves the most vulnerable around the world and support programs related to these areas of need.



World Communion Offering

World Communion Offering is seen to be part of the atonement that happens around God's Table as celebrate communion at His Table. It focuses on cultivating reconciliation by supporting racial and gender justice, peace-making efforts, global witness and nurturing, and ecumenical and interfaith relations. Their goal is to use these funds to support grants to local churches that have programs that support ministry in these areas.



Christmas Joy Offering

Christmas Joy Offering supports causes and ministries that serve God's children, youth and young adults, leadership development for people of color, and the needs of the servants of the church through the Board of Pensions.


