A workday was held August 3rd, thank you to everyone that showed up, and especially the brave souls that were doing yard work in the oppressive heat.

The East Hall Door is in bad shape. It doesn't close properly and twice the wind has caught it and damaged the door closer, frame and hinges. Also the bottom of the door frame is rusted away and the sweep is non-existent which contributed to our insect problem a few months ago. We are investigating whether the door is repairable or will require complete replacement.

Here's what's happening with the Building and Grounds Department:

Bell Brothers serviced the air conditioners before the heat of the summer. The sanctuary, zone system and 2nd floor systems are working well. The fellowship hall unit is from 1980 and has one bad fan motor. The other unit in the sanctuary staircase is not working at all. We will be trying to get some quotes from them to replace failing units.





## New Sound System Coming SOON!




Thank you all so much for your patience this summer as we have had to make do with a patched together sound system. The equipment is in and we plan to install everything **September 10-12**.
