
Officer Elections and Gratitude for Service



Once a month, a dedicated group from Windsor Presbyterian show up in style for our community bringing delicious to home-cooked meals! Their friendly faces and consistent presence insure we are able to meet the need in River Bend while keeping our costs down. CFUM is greatly appreciative of Windsor Presbyterian and the efforts of every group who has supported us in combatting food insecurity through our Supper Club program!

Beginning March 1st, we are returning to communal dining with a to-go option! After 4 years of take-out style Supper Club, we are eager to reconnect with community members once again in a more formal, comfortable fashion!





Last year Windsor Presbyterian supplied 1,800 meals to our community! "We really love serving in person, being able to come down, meet with everybody and hang out, it's a good feeling to be able to help." Said Linda Newsom, an organizer of Windsor's Supper Club group. "It's a privilege to be able to help and we're so grateful for that opportunity."

This year we are averaging 8 unclaimed Supper Club dates a month. You can help by <u>supporting</u> our mission or getting a group of friends/co-workers together for a unique, rewarding cooking project!

To anyone on the fence about sponsoring a Supper Club meal, Linda says "I don't think you'd regret it. It seems like we get more out of it than we give. We never lack volunteers, we usually have about 10 people work on a meal and they are happy to help. You are helping kids and people stretch their food budgets, that's part of our call as Christians, to feed the hungry. It may sound like a lot of work but we don't feel like that. We feel like it's energizing, not draining. It's just a positive experience all around!"




