#### **Parking Lot Task Force**

Session has appointed a task force to oversee the demolition of the three homes and construction of the parking lot. Members are Bob Cooper, Ron Grohe, Angie King, Dana Mitchell, Rich Teig, and Dwight Tomes. The asbestos abatement is complete and you can see they removed windows, roofing and other building materials containing or suspected to contain asbestos.

Currently the task force is evaluating four separate bids for the demolition of the houses. That work will begin soon. They are also in negotiation with a civil engineer to develop a site plan and oversee the construction. You may see surveyors out to begin their work.




Lent is an important time in the liturgical year, we need to hear the many ways Jesus shows us how we are to be in the world. Easter is the time to celebrate His message, and give our response.
