



#### Advent/Christmas Visual Arts Team




Our Presbyterian Women study in 2024 was called "Sacred Encounters: The Power and Presence of Jesus Christ in Luke-Acts." Like all the PW lesson books, this is written BY women, FOR women, which offers us a more personal look at our faith from a woman's perspective. We read about sacred encounters that happened to Elizabeth, Mary and Martha, Lydia, people with physical and mental disabilities, the Ethiopian eunuch, and others.



PW sponsored a summer and a winter "Clean Out Your Closet" clothing drive, both of which were wildly successful and garnered a large number of donations. A big thanks to all who contributed. The clothes were given to Bidwell-Riverside Community Center, a part of the Families Forward organization, which consists of four groups: Bidwell, providing food, clothing, and basic essentials to all in need, Child Development Center, providing affordable, high quality early childhood education for families on limited incomes, New Directions Shelter, providing emergency shelter and supportive services for families experiencing homelessness, and The Home Connection, providing vulnerable families affordable homes while they work to achieve economic self-sufficiency. Each year, our PW group engages in an outreach project. If anyone has an idea for 2025, let us know.

The 2025 PW study, beginning in March, is called "Let Justice Roll Down: God's Call to Care for Neighbors and All Creation." We'll discuss environmental justice, land justice, food justice, water justice, air justice, economic justice, intergenerational justice, and others. This will be a timely and fascinating study, sure to bring great discussion and learning opportunities. We meet on the third Saturday of the month from March through November at 10:00 am in Ward Hall. Join us this year. Each lesson is stand-alone, so if you can't come regularly, it makes no difference. We invite all Windsor Women to attend when schedules permit.

**WOW** started off in the spring with a joint Lenten study with our neighbors at Windsor United Methodist. This was followed by a fun look at some of the most well-known hymns and the background and circumstances that led to their creation. We called it "Beer and Hymns - Hymns of the Faith" because some hymns were written to beer hall melodies so they would seem more familiar to people! One of the best loved hymns, "Here I Am Lord" was actually written in two days by a seminary student, Dan Schutte, who was suffering from the flu! A fellow student asked him on a Wednesday to write a song for an ordination scheduled for the weekend. On Friday, he ran it over to his friend, making edits on the way. True story!





Summer brought the gathering of a Grief Group - Holding Space for seasons of grief and loss, which proved to be a personal and moving experience. In the fall, we read and discussed a book entitled "Tending the Wild Garden: Growing in the Fruit of the Spirit," followed by an Advent month of decorating the church, singing Christmas carols,

drinking hot chocolate, and enjoying the Holiday season with fellowship and fun.



Adult Sunday School met each Sunday at 9:15 in Ward Hall, using The Wired Word for our discussions. The Wired Word is published by Communications Resources, a business that publishes material for churches. There is an Editorial Board and a Senior Editor, Stan Pardum, who decide the topics. Scriptural reference material is provided to facilitate discussions about matters of faith raised by news of the week. Each Friday, the lesson is emailed to participants. If you would like to be added to our email list, let me know. We explored a wide variety of different topics such as, weather disasters, social media influence, demoralized teachers, Jesus's childhood, elite athletes and their faith practices, Israel/Palestine war, stranded astronauts, depression, new discoveries of old artifacts and one lesson was all about Caitlin Clark! YAY! We look forward to another year of great conversations about current events and how to approach them in a faith-based manner.

There's a lot going on at Windsor, that's for sure! Huge thanks to Laura Ward and Beth Mogle for everything they bring to your Discipleship Team.

Our communication shepherd, Natalie Steenson, has a wonderful knack for elevating Windsor's message into something truly moving. Thanks to her vision and perseverance in expanding our digital offerings, our website can reach up to 8x the number of physical attendees we see in church and on zoom each Sunday.

#### Highlights in the past year - Psalm Treasury, Follow Friday

The Psalm Treasury is a collection of one-of-a-kind recordings of the Psalms from our own congregation, put together with contemplative music and beautiful imagery sourced from many of our own creative members. The result is an anthology unique to Windsor – and there's still time to participate, either by yourself or with family and friends. Natalie makes it easy and can edit over any verbal slip ups we all have when speaking naturally.

We've recently expanded the Psalm Treasury into 5"x4" Notecards, featuring photographs and scriptures and our website url on the back with information on how to see and hear the various Psalms that have been recorded! What a wonderful way to share with others about the faith and beauty at Windsor Presbyterian Church.

**Follow Friday** is about getting into the habit of checking in with Windsor's social media accounts on a weekly basis to help amplify our spiritual message to the wider community. We might offer a scripture to ponder, an invitation to go on a faith journey, announce a special event or a shout out to a volunteer activity. To Follow is an echo of the invitation Jesus made to each of the disciples to take up the work of the church, and this is something every member with a Facebook or Intragram account can do.

Each engagement – a "like", a heart, sharing with your own social media followers, a thoughtful comment – helps:

- Get the word out about Windsor, without a sound.
- Gives a friendly wave to our neighbors, all over the city.
- Opens our red door wide, every day of the week.
- Generates compound interest in what's happening, without spending a penny.

This small action can make a big impact in how likely we are to bring in potential visitors Sunday morning, and to be the church together even when we are away from our favorite pew or Zoom screen.

#### Audio/Visual Sanctuary Upgrades

The long-awaited audio/visual upgrades and sanctuary refresh was made a reality this year due to generous contributions from both current and former members, as well as dedicated volunteers. The purchase of new equipment was made possible by Memorial Funds earmarked for technology updates and approved by Session.

We've had a true friend in expert sound engineer Brain Dobson, who's impressive range of audio experience across the state really worked to our



advantage. He helped us select equipment within our budget, with room to grow for future expansion, and spent many weeks making sure the installation was successful. A special mention goes to Richard Ankeney, who helped devise several custom solutions to mount the new equipment and make adjustments to the front nave and upper balcony. Dana Mitchell has been instrumental in getting our set up for Sunday service up and running smoothly. Plus many other volunteers willing to help with everything from sound checks to climbing up really tall ladders – we appreciate all of you!

Look for additional training options on the new A/V system over the next few months; we'd like to have several members with knowledge on how to run the equipment to complement our slide and zoom volunteers.

It's been wonderful to see the many improvements come together this year, and I appreciate the opportunity to serve this small church with a big heart.




#### Communication Helps Grow our Community

## Outreach: Mission and Generosity by Beth Schmitz




#### Engaging in Mission to Our Community

#### CFUM Mission Project Continues to Grow Strong

In 2024, Children and Family Urban Movement (CFUM) continued to be a strong mission project for us under the guidance of Linda and Jim Newsom. We provided 75 meals to adults and children each month on the first Thursday of the month. A balanced meal of cheesy potato casserole, corn or green beans, fresh veggies, a homemade dinner roll, a cherry Jello salad, cake, and assorted cookies is our offering each month; and, we have received lovely compliments from the CFUM staff that our meal is one of the best that is offered and our volunteers are some of the friendliest towards the families that participate in this community outreach offering. In December, we once again provided a \$10 gift to the adults in the program. If there are leftovers, CFUM saves them to provide a meal on a night when there are no volunteers. Linda and Jim Newsom are supported by many volunteers and donations. Linda Newsom shares that the volunteers enjoy the time together in fellowship with each other working on a project that aligns with Windsor Presbyterian's values and Christ's values. Linda encourages us to look at Matthew 25:37 - 40 for the purpose we serve through this mission. It is a program we will continue to support through the coming year. Thank you to Jim and Linda for all your time and dedication in leading this mission and to all the members/volunteers who have contributed in some way to the success of this program.







#### Providing Meals for Iowa Fresh Start and Meals for the Heartland

This year we started a new mission connection with the Iowa Fresh Start program. This program was introduced to us by Bob Culbertson. Iowa Fresh Start is a program that works with adult female offenders to support them with job placement, education, and substance abuse programming. In the fall, members of the congregation provided an evening meal to the participants. They prepared the food and served the meal to them and then joined them in the meal, allowing an opportunity to connect with them. A chance to tell their individual life stories is a valuable resource to women who are dealing with difficult lives and circumstances. Meals are provided twice a month to the participants and several other churches are also providing meals. During 2025, our plan is to provide dinner three to four times to the program spread out over the year. Our first for this year will be in January with additional meals in May and September. Thanks to all who have contributed to this project.

#### Food Pantry Collections for DMARC and Little Food Pantries

We continued our participation with the DMARC Food Pantry, reaching our goal and making a total contribution of \$5,753.00. We collected money for DMARC throughout the year and during some special food pantry offerings in honor of mothers and fathers. The DMARC contributions continue to reflect the generosity of our members and our commitment to addressing the issue of food insecurity in the local community. We have set the goal for DMARC contributions at \$5,000.00 again this year and there is no doubt that we will reach and exceed it again. We had a special collection of soups for Souper Bowl Sunday and were truly blessed by the amount of soup that was donated for our little neighborhood food pantries. It carried us through the tough winter months. Replenishing the food pantries is required frequently throughout the week. Thanks to our church secretary, Carol Heilman, who helps to stock the food pantry on the days that she is here. Just before Thanksgiving, we collected over \$200.00 in a special food pantry collection to use in support of our little food pantries. Several members of the congregation participated in the Third Annual Short Hike for Hunger through our neighborhood in October. We were joined in the by the ministers of Windsor United Methodist

Church and Windsor Heights Lutheran Church.

Thanks be to God for a fairly uneventful 2024 for the upkeep and use of our beautiful building and facilities.

Some of our projects this year included:

- Ward Hall floor was stripped and waxed.
- The North portion of the building had some tuckpointing repairs done.
- We had a workday in April to do some cleanup and small projects around the church, one of which was an unexpected sewer backup in the basement kitchen.
- We needed to have some pest control application done, possibly due to the demolition of the houses to the North.
- Kitchen stove, exhaust filters and fire suppression annual inspection was performed.
- Air conditioning units were inspected and preventative maintenance performed on them. Some of the units are inoperable and will need replacing in the future.
- Our fire alarm connection was changed to a cellular connection, bypassing the unreliable CenturyLink land lines for this important function.
- The east door by the office was replaced.
