We will meet for a short intro on horseback promptly at 1 pm to give you an overview of the plan for your workshop.

Protective headgear is mandatory for juniors and optional for adults; but encouraged.

If you are a seasoned pro or a newbie....it doesnt matter.....

these workshops are for you and your horse to have fun!.....and be challenged.

Yes we have a mounting block in the field just outside the ring.

As this is a workshop, I do not have any food scheduled or items to purchase here. If you would like snacks, or food, please bring along your own items.

Please remember to either take your litter with you or throw it out in the garbage cans provided.

We are about safety - make sure you are safe and your horse remains safe!!

No dogs unless they remain inside a vehicle/trailer for everyone's safety.
