



This month, we have a call with Dr. C on the 12th about his other venture called Dragonfire Acoustics. Sorry, temporarily cancelled.



Roy's Record Reviews

Having had several discussions with club members regarding Classical music there seems to be one piece that is more of a AAVC favorite than any other. I am referring to the masterpiece that is Shostakovich's Fifth Symphony. Frankly, I couldn't agree more, it's a stunning piece of symphonic music. The piece has beauty, drama, a sense of history, and guite a bit of sadness and finally triumph.

Shostakovich (1906-1975) was highly revered in his time, but his life was anything but a smooth easy existence. Living under Stalin created perils for every Russian and Shostakovich was no exception. I placed some links for a further examination of the composer's life under the ultra-harsh rule of the Stalinist regime.

LAST MONTH'S MEETING RECAP

The Club was pleased to be invited for a return visit to the factory of Dan D'Agostino Master Audio Systems, in Cave Creek. Some 27-ish club members showed up for the event. There was a snack bar providing a few munchies, as well as beer and wine. Dan's lovely wife Petra was doing a great job of greeting and making club members feel right at home. After a pleasant period of socializing, Bill McKiegan, President of the company, opened with a somewhat in-depth discourse about the company and Dan's history as one of the leading amplifier designers in the world.

Bill, then introduced the man himself, Dan D'Agostino. Dan shared some of his design philosophy followed by an overview of his products and specifics about a few of them. You could tell that Dan takes great pride regarding the company's policy of making his products perpetually upgradable to current specs, such that when new advancements that are incorporated into his models owners can send their pieces to his factory and have them fitted with the updates.

The facility had on hand a couple of the Relentless monoblock amps that were nearing completion, and he displayed and talked about them to the interested crowd. Coming in at just under 700 pounds and putting out a whopping 1500 WPC (at 8 ohms), it is not an amplifier for everyone, but it sure is impressive. Expect to pay around \$300K for these beasts.

A highlight of the presentation was the unveiling (literally – it had a covering over it) of the brand-new Relentless preamplifier. A three-box piece, it has not yet been released but should be soon. Like other D'Agostino gear, it will not come cheap. A headphone amp is in the works, but it is not finished and Dan is not sure when it will be ready for release.

Of some interest to many readers that could not attend, is that Dan uses DCS gear for digital input and almost exclusively Wilson Audio speakers for evaluation and listening tests. We heard a pair of Sasha DAWs being driven by an integrated out on the factory floor. There was no real sonic evaluation of D'Agostino gear by the club as the sound room on the north side of the facility is being reworked to add some new office space.


