From Pastor Erika

I had the honor and privilege of attending the 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly in Phoneix, AZ as a voting member. There were 802 voting members and many visitors that totaled around 1,000 people from all over the United States and Puerto Rico. The meetings lasted 2-4 hours at a time all day long with breaks for worship and meals. There was much work to be done because the Churchwide Assembly only convenes every 3 years. We elected a new presiding bishop and a new secretary which have 6 year terms. Both of these positions took all 5 ballots each. Our new presiding bishop is Bishop Yehiel Curry of the Chicago Metropolitan Synod and our new secretary is Pastor Lucille Mills of the North Carolina synod. Bishop Curry will be installed on October 4th in Minneapolis. A couple of other important business actions of the assembly was to pass a new social statement "Faith and Civic Life: Seeking the Well-Being of All;" to approve edits to the social statement "Human Sexuality: Gift and Trust;" and many memorials including Indian Boarding School Remembrance, Stand of Palestinian Rights and an end to the occupation of Palestine and many edits to the Constitution. I was amazed by the sheer amount of work that was to be done and how long it takes because so many people have different opinions and thoughts. I also loved watching Bishop Eaton lead the meetings because she did it so efficiently- she stuck to the rules, she didn't let her emotions show when people were at the microphone with some really different viewpoints and she was funny. When there was a question about Robert's Rules or about voting and the people in charge needed to talk they would play a video on an ELCA ministry or we would sing. We always prayed before a vote. It was amazing to worship with that many people and hear all those voices sing familiar and unfamiliar hymns. There were definitely points of contention and times when people's feelings got hurt but that is the messiness and brokenness of the church and it's going to happen at every level but you could also feel the Holy Spirit and the grace of God in that place. Thank you for allowing me to go and represent Northeast Iowa Synod and this congregation. The next churchwide assembly will be in 2028 in Des Moines, please consider being a voting member or even a volunteer! ELCA churches do not look the same throughout the United States but we all are connected because of the Triune God. Bishop Eaton had 4 emphasis of her time as presiding bishop: We are church. We are Lutheran. We are church together. We are church for the sake of the world.

REGULAR MEETING MINUTES St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Masting August 12, 2025

Council Meeting August 13, 2025

(The August Minutes are printed but pending approval at the September 10th Council Meeting)

Present: Crystal Thurn, Danielle Friedlein, Lois Garms, Steve Johnson, Justin Birdnow, Ashley Blietz-Camp, Kevin Brainard, Beth Foels, Barbara Horns, and Rein Kregel. Absent: Pastor Erika Lenth, Tiffany Torkelson, Andy Meyer, and Craig Watson

Meeting called to order by council President, Crystal Thurn, at 6:02 pm. Devotions were led by Justin Birdnow. Next month is Ashley Blietz-Camp

Minutes of Council Meeting: Minutes from the July 16th council meeting were reviewed. Justin Birdnow motioned to approve the minutes as printed. Kevin Brainard seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report & Bills: Danielle shared that offering and attendance were down in July. We spent \$8,178.23 more than was brought in. The office air conditioning bill of \$3,531.00 was paid, with the money being moved from the Current Fund holding account. In July, the Memorial Fund brought in \$1,835.85 with \$20.00 being In Loving Memory memorials. July expenses from the Memorial Fund were \$1,550.00 from the Solar Fund towards the principal balance and \$3,351.00 from CF Holding for the office air conditioner. The current principal balance on the solar loan is \$77,114.68. Black Hills Energy monthly payment will be increasing from \$776.00 to \$1,012.00 per month. Ashley Blietz-Camp motioned to approve the treasurer's report. Barbara Horns seconded. Motion carried.

Correspondence: Crystal received a thank you from AEL Inc, the company that installed the balcony chair lift.

Pastor's Report: Pastor is currently on vacation in North Dakota and will give a full report in September on the Churchwide Assembly. She will officiate Leila Kilcher's funeral on August 21st.

Education & Youth: Heidi, Pastor, and the Sunday School teachers met on August 10th. A backup date was selected for the Christmas Program, which would take place the following Wednesday night. Confirmation classes begin on August 27th, and the Luther League will be hosting their Ice Cream Social on Sunday, August 24th with a meeting afterwards to plan their yearly events.

Fellowship & Evangelism: No report

Mission & Social Ministry: School supplies were taken down to SOTH by Celia Brown. The next meeting is October 5th at 10:15 a.m..

Property & Grounds: No report. Kevin is still working on stripping the red tiles and hopes to have that done before the Ice Cream Social. Kevin and Lois are in the process of discussing landscaping around the parsonage.

Cemetery: Met recently and finances were discussed. The arch is in the process of being painted.

Stewardship & Finance: No report

Worship & Music: No report. Next meeting is September 9th.

Interchurch Council: No report. Next meeting is September 29th.

New Business: Office Schedule: Danielle asked the council if they would be opposed to a change in her weekly in-office hours to Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday, with all other work being completed from home. Justin Birdnow motioned to approve Danielle's new schedule. Lois Garm seconded. Motion carried. Danielle also shared that her and Aaron are 4-H leaders for Giard Eager Hands and their current meeting place isn't always available so they are looking elsewhere. Barbara Horns motioned to allow Giard Eager Hands use of the fellowship hall on the second Sunday evening of each month for their meetings. Steve Johnson seconded. Motion carried.

Resurfacing The Parking Lot—Meeting Notice

In further discussion regarding the blacktopping of the parking lot, Kluesner Construction will honor their bid of \$79,840.00 until next spring if we or they decide to wait until next year to do it. If there is a sharp increase in raw materials, the price will be adjusted and we will be given the option to accept or deny the bid at that time. Mark Bries came in with a bid of \$5,550.00 to tear out the old sidewalk and prepare for blacktopping. He will honor his pricing until next year unless there is a sharp increase in materials at which time he will rebid and we can accept or deny.

Total cost, \$85,390.00

How will we pay for this?

Raise money until work is complete and finance the rest using the Endowment CD as collateral.

We will have a Congregation Meeting on September 21st after service in the fellowship hall. Notice of this meeting will be given on the two proceeding Sundays (the 7th and 14th).

Per the St. Paul Constitution, C8.02, a Voting Member is defined as:

Voting Members are Confirmed Members (baptized persons who have been confirmed in this congregation, those who have been received by adult baptism, or by transfer as confirmed members from other Lutheran congregations, or baptized persons received by affirmation of faith). Such Confirmed Members, during the current or preceding calendar year, shall have communed in this congregation and shall have made a contribution of record to this congregation. Members of this congregation who have satisfied these basic standards shall have the privilege of voice and vote at every regular and special meeting of the congregation.


