

REGULAR MEETING MINUTES St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Meeting July 16, 2025

(The July Minutes are printed but pending approval at the August 13th Council Meeting)

Present: Crystal Thurn, Pastor Erika Lenth, Danielle Friedlein, Lois Garms, Steve Johnson, Justin Birdnow, Ashley Blietz-Camp, Kevin Brainard, Andy Meyer, Barbara Horns, and Craig Watson. Absent: Tiffany Torkelson, Beth Foels, Rein Kregel

Meeting called to order by council President, Crystal Thurn, at 6:02 pm. Devotions were led by Andy Meyer. Next month is Justin Birdnow.

Minutes of Council Meeting: Minutes from the June 11th council meeting were reviewed and one correction was noted. Lois Garms motioned to approve the minutes with the correction. Barb Horns seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report & Bills: Danielle shared that although we spent a lot of money in June, we brought in \$240.58 more than we spent. June expenditures included part of our Church Mutual insurance premiums, paid in full for the year, electrical inspection and repairs, rerouting the gutter pipes, repair of the automatic opener for the east door for \$1,299.84, and the church's share for the new parsonage door. Memorials received totaled \$4,184.82 with \$20.00 being In Loving Memory memorials and \$3,659.90 for interest paid out from our Endowment CD. Expenses from Memorial accounts included \$1,370.00 for the Sunday School's Mission Project, God's Global Barnyard, \$1,102.73 from the Parsonage Fund for the parsonage door, \$1,812.50 from Committee Choice for the balance due for the balcony chair lift, \$146.00 from the SS fund for stamps for the Nursery Room's Special Friends Project, and \$2,441.60 transferred from CF Holding for the parsonage door and electrical repairs. We received some special offering designated toward the solar loan that has been applied to the principal balance. As of July 8th, our principal balance is \$77,407.16. A big thank you to Jeremy and Traci Musil who paid \$500 toward the chair lift. This covered the sales tax that was not included in the original estimate. A thank you has been sent on behalf of the church. Pastor Erika will be gone the week of July 28th and it's also Clayton County Fair week so the office will be closed on Tuesday and Thursday. Steve Johnson motioned to approve the treasurer's report. Ashley Blietz-Camp seconded. Motion carried.

Correspondence: None

Pastor's Report: Pastor reported mileage of 236 totaling \$165.20 for June. Justin Birdnow motioned to approve Pastor's mileage. Kevin Brainard seconded. Motion carried. Pastor shared she has made numerous visits to Garden View and nursing homes. She recently attended confirmation camp at EWALU with 4 students. Confirmation camp had 21 campers and all together, 160 campers spent the week at EWALU. She will fly out to Arizona on July 28th for Churchwide assembly.

Education & Youth: Next meeting with Sunday School teachers is set for Sunday, August 10th.

Fellowship & Evangelism: Meeting will be set soon.

Mission & Social Ministry: Game and movie night will be Sunday, July 20th with games starting at 4:00, light meal at 5:00, and movie at 5:30 in the fellowship hall. SOTH school supply bus is now out and we will be collecting supplies through August 3rd. The Fall Dinner will be held November 9th and the next meeting will be October 5th.

Property & Grounds: Kevin has started stripping the red tile and his goal is to finish before Sunday School starts.

Stewardship & Finance: Met on July 14th. Discussion included the parking lot and chair lift maintenance plan. Budget vs actual income and expenses were reviewed.

Worship & Music: Met on July 15th. We have two outdoor services left, August 3rd with Diane Fisk leading worship, and September 7th which is also God's Work Our Hands. Fourth graders will receive their bibles on September 14th, Pastor will be gone on October 19th, and Confirmation/Reformation Sunday is October 26th. There is an upcoming private baptism in August and wedding on October 25th.

Interchurch Council: The Methodist church is hosting Vacation Bible School on July 23rd from 9-4 for children leaving grades K-6. The Goodwill truck will be in Monona on September 27th and we will host this year's Thanksgiving Eve service.

Old Business: Signage on the display entering Monona: the signs have been placed. Discussion was also held on updating three signs in various locations in town. Justin Birdnow motioned to have Schultz Sign Company create three new signs. Steve Johnson seconded. Motion carried.

Balcony Chair Lift: Has been installed and information was provided on the maintenance plan. Craig Watson motioned to approve purchasing the Maintenance Plan that includes an annual inspection for \$475.00. Kevin Brainard seconded. Motion carried. Parking Lot Resurfacing: Special congregation meeting will be held on September 21st. Notice of this meeting will be given on September 7th and September 14th, and will also be shared in the September St. Paul News. Basement Cleaning/Sorting: Justin, Andy, Kevin, and Crystal will meet in August to organize items for auction. Office Air Conditioner: has been installed and works great.

New Business: None

Next Meeting will be Wednesday, August 13th at 6:00 pm

Kevin Brainard motioned to adjourn the meeting at 7:19 pm. Andy Meyer seconded. Motion carried.

Resurfacing The Parking Lot—Meeting Notice

It has been decided to look into resurfacing or blacktopping the parking lot. Reasons are to make it safer by eliminating trip hazards and easier to maintain.

We would remove the sidewalks on the south and east sides of the parking in order to make it a level surface. We received bids from Kluesner Construction from Farely, IA and Strub Blacktopping from Lansing, IA to do the blacktopping. Kluesner had the lower bid of \$79,840.00. We are waiting for bids from Mark Bries Construction and Nathan Welch Excavating to remove the present sidewalk and prepare for blacktopping. The estimate from both parties to do the sidewalk is \$10,000.00. We will get firm bids from them at a later date. Total cost, 90,000.00.

How will we pay for this? There are several options that have been brought up...

- 1. We'll finance the entire amount using the endowment CD as collateral. On a 10 year loan the payments would be \$976.00/month and on a 5 year loan payments would be \$1,719.00
- 2. We currently have about \$20,000.00 in our holding account we could use and finance \$70,000.00. On a ten year loan payments would be \$760.00 and a five year loan would be \$1,528.00.
- 3. Raise 50% of the money before having it done.
- 4. Raise 100% of the money before having it done.

Council will continue to discuss and look at options.

We'll have a Congregation Meeting on September 21st after service in the fellowship hall. Notice of this meeting will be given on the two preceding Sundays (the 7th and 14th) and by mail in the September church newsletter.


