From Pastor Erika

As I sit in my office, I am praying for an epiphany because I have writer's block. Christmas is such a huge celebration and holiday that I think Epiphany gets pushed to the side. The official date of Epiphany is January 6th and in the church we celebrate it on the date or the Sunday close to it. Epiphany is the day the three wise men, Magi or kings as they are known by all names, arrived to where Mary, Joseph and the baby Jesus were. When we think of the Christmas story, Christmas decorations such as the nativity scene, and Christmas carols we put the wise men arriving around the time of the shepherds. But when we look at the birth story in Matthew 2:1-12, the Magi come after Jesus was born and inquire of King Herod where they might find him because they had followed the new star. If you notice the nativity scene that is put in the front by the altar, we do not put the wise men there because they don't arrive until after the birth. It's a reminder that there is still more to celebrate. Epiphany is the day that Jesus is revealed to all nations because the Magi weren't Jewish. Jesus is the Savior of all people. Epiphany is the season for house blessings and the time to take down Christmas decorations as the season of Christmas is over. In many countries this is known as Three Kings Day and is a big festival and children get another present. So while Christmas has come and gone in record time again, a new year has begun- how are we already in 2025? We still are amazed by God's love revealed through Jesus Christ- Emmanuel: God with us. The joy, love and peace we find in Christmas doesn't end there, it continues into Epiphany when Jesus was revealed as Savior, Messiah, Prince of Peace to all the nations and people. The birth story of Jesus was a series of epiphanies for Mary, Joseph, Elizabeth & Zechariah, the shepherds and the Magi, even for King Herod. An epiphany is a moment of sudden realization or revelation, sometimes today we call it an "aha moment" when you have an idea or something sinks into your brain. For all the people surrounding the birth of Jesus they all had moments of clarity that the birth of this baby would change the world which excited most people and scared King Herod. As we begin this new year, we are entering into it with hope, excitement, apprehension & fear, but always remember that Christmas and Epiphany, Easter and Pentecost are not a once a year occurrence- God did and does enter into this world to be with us in our trials and sadness, fear & apprehension, joy and celebrations in Jesus revealing God's love, forgiveness and abundant life. While the decorations are put away and life is back to whatever normal is, God has never and will never leave us, take time to look around and you may have an epiphany!

2025 Noisy Can

The Church Council has voted to give the 2025 Noisy Can donations to benefit the Driftless Area Wetlands Centre (DAWC) in Marquette. The DAWC provides many camps and school activities that benefit the children our congregation and they have also started offering new programming for adults with dementia and their caregivers. This new program could likely bring more individuals with mobility challenges to the DAWC. Part of the proceeds will go to help congregation member Hannah Friedlein, from Scouts BSA Troop 138, fund her Eagle Scout service project to build 4 handicap accessible picnic tables for the DAWC. St. Paul is the sponsoring Charter Organization for Scouts BSA Troop 138. Friedlein is also exploring estimates on an automatic door opener to help individuals with mobility issues. Any proceeds raised beyond the cost of materials for the accessible picnic tables will be given to the DAWC to be used toward an automatic door opener or to help fund programming.

Council Meeting December 10, 2024

Meeting called to order by council President, Crystal Thurn, at 6:02 pm. Devotions were led by Crystal Thurn for Justin Birdnow. Next month is Ashley Blietz-Camp.

Minutes of Council Meeting: Minutes from the November 13th council meeting were reviewed. Steve Johnson motioned to approve the minutes as printed. Barb Tieskoetter seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report & Bills: Danielle shared that in the month of November we brought in \$3733.33 more than we spent. The Memorial Fund brought in \$3094.69 with \$20.00 being In Loving Memory memorials. The organ will be tuned on December 18. Committee annual reports are due by the end of the year. Kevin Brainard motioned to approve the treasurer's report. Ashley Blietz-Camp seconded. Motion carried.

Correspondence: Thank you received from LSI for the donation made in August.

Pastor's Report: Pastor presided over Ivan Krueger's funeral with Elaine Melcher's taking place December 14th. She had her monthly visit to Garden View and confirmation classes continue to go well, and they are having short classes after Advent services. She also attended our Thanksgiving Eve service and mentioned about 50 people attended. Pastor had a great time in New York City on vacation. No mileage to report.

Education & Youth: Met November 18th. Sunday school is averaging 55-76 children per week, and the Christmas program will be Dec. 15th. There is a need for more teachers to split up by grades due to large class sizes. 11 children will receive First Communion on Maundy Thursday, April 17th. Budget was approved. Next meeting is February 17th.

Mission & Social Ministry: Met November 17th to go over Fall Dinner recap. Christmas Giving Tree has been placed through December 8th. Budget was approved.

Door Estimate-Received estimate from Mary Bissell Construction for \$3,567.82 for materials and installation. Storm door estimate is \$702.91, equaling \$4,272.73. R&R Auto will paint the door. Lois Garms motioned to approve the estimate for purchase and installation of both doors. Linda Staff seconded. Motion carried.

Railing on Basement Stairs- Shawn has the north stairwell completed, and will be working on the south stairwell soon.

Other-Floor tiles in the basement discussed last month will be replaced as time permits.

New Business:

Noisy Can Inquiry (Hannah Friedlein)-Hannah will be partnering with Driftless Area Wetlands Centre on an upcoming project for handicap and Dementia patrons for her Eagle Scout project. She will be building handicap accessible picnic tables and would like to contribute to the cost of a handicap door opener if possible. The cost of materials for the picnic tables is \$400-500 and the door opener is \$2,000-3,000. Hannah asked if Noisy Can donations for 2025 could be allocated towards her project and any money above what is needed for the picnic table project would be given to the Wetlands Center towards the purchase of the door opener or other projects. Lois Garms motioned to allocate 2025 Noisy Can donations towards the Driftless Area Wetlands Centre and Hannah's Eagle Scout project. Kevin Brainard seconded. Motion carried.

2025 Budget-Kevin Brainard presented the 2025 budget. Steve Johnson motioned to approve the 2025 budget as presented. Ashley Blietz-Camp seconded. Motion carried.

Church Carillon Amplifier-The bell tower has been buzzing when music is played. In order to fix this issue, a new amplifier needs to be purchased at an estimate of \$500. Lois Garms motioned to purchase a new amplifier. Kevin seconded. Motion carried.

Next Meeting will be the Annual Meeting on January 19, 2025 at 10:00 am.

Andy Meyer motioned to adjourn the meeting at 7:26 pm. Kevin Brainard seconded. Motion carried.


