REGULAR MEETING MINUTES St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Meeting April 7, 2025

(The April Minutes are printed but pending approval at the May 14th Council Meeting)

Present: Crystal Thurn, Pastor Erika Lenth, Danielle Fridelein, Lois Garms, Ashley Blietz-Camp, Justin Birdnow, Kevin Brainard, Barbara Horns, Beth Foels, and Shawn Thurn. Absent: Steve Johnson, Rein Kregel, Andy Meyer, Tiffany Torkelson, and Craig Watson

Meeting called to order by council President, Crystal Thurn, at 6:32 pm. Devotions were led by Crystal Thurn. Next month is Tiffany Torkelson.

Minutes of Council Meeting: Minutes from the March 10th council meeting were reviewed. Justin Birdnow motioned to approve the minutes as printed. Kevin Brainard seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report & Bills: Danielle shared that we spent \$438.91 more than we brought in for March. Memorials received totaled \$3,667.47, with \$20 being In Loving Memory memorials. March expenses included parsonage deck supplies and worship supplies. Our telephone listing has been updated and should save us \$577.00 over the next year. Our insurance policy carrier is requiring us to have an electrical survey completed. Kregel Electric will perform for the cost of \$275.00. Kevin Brainard motioned to approve Kregel Electric to perform the survey. Barbara Horns seconded. Motion carried. Our insurance deductibles have increased from \$5,000 to \$10,000 for building and water damage and \$50,000 for hail damage. Our annual premium has also increased from \$9,980.00 to \$14,466.00 which is still a savings since switching from Grinnell Mutual. Ashley Blietz-Camp motioned to approve the treasurer's report. Lois Garms seconded. Motion carried.

Correspondence: A letter was received from Tony Goodrich. SOTH is asking for donations to help offset the cost of unexpectedly replacing their furnace. Lois Garms motioned that we take special offering through May then discuss the total donation amount further. Justin Birdnow seconded. Motion carried

Pastor's Report: Pastor shared that Lent has been busy but going well. Acolytes have completed training for Holy week and there will be a baptism on Palm Sunday and another in June. Upcoming events for this month besides Easter is the last night of confirmation class and ConFest.

Education & Youth: Next meeting is April 14th at 6:00 pm.

Fellowship & Evangelism: Met on Sunday, April 6th. Senior recognition is coming up.

Mission & Social Ministry: Met on March 23rd. Progressive supper is set for May 4th at 4:00 pm. We are asking for donations to the Clayton County Food Shelf this year.

Property & Grounds: Kevin has started work on the parsonage deck, the railing and skirting is left but the project will be completed soon. The wall repair will take place mid May. The anticipated date for the parsonage door was last updated to May 5th. Shawn shared he has another plan for repair of the office air conditioning before moving forward with replacement.

Worship & Music: Met on March 11th. Upcoming events are: Senior recognition for 8 students is May 11th, Pentecost is June 8th, and Lamborn/Gilitzer wedding is October 25th. Summer services have been discussed but not set. Looking for congregation members interested in reinstating the prayer chain. Also discussed is changing the setting for worship more often moving forward.

Interchurch Council: Met on March 31st. Bachelorette will be held at Giard Methodist on May 14th. Goodwill truck is May 10th and is sponsored by St. John's Luana/Farmersburg. Monona United Methodist will be hosting VBS this summer. Next meeting is set for June 30th.

Old Business: Signage for Monona display at Gateway park: there is an issue with the printing of our logo. We will have them try to include the ELCA logo instead. Custodial position: the posting will be altered to only include the general cleaning duties listed. Going forward, we will ask for volunteers to help complete any special projects.

New Business: The Sunday School department has looked into purchasing four Smart TVs that will be used in Sunday School and the library. Each 55" TV will cost approximately \$228.00 and costs of wall/cart mounts range from \$25-60 with the proceeds coming from Easter Grass donations and Sunday School memorial fund. Lois Garms motioned to proceed purchasing four TVs and mounts. Kevin Brainard seconded. Motion carried.

Next Meeting will be Monday, May 14th at 6:00 pm

Ashley Blietz-Camp motioned to adjourn the meeting at 7:42 pm. Kevin Brainard seconded. Motion carried.


