

# REGULAR MEETING MINUTES St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Meeting March 10, 2025

(The March Minutes are printed but pending approval at the April 7th Council Meeting)

**Present:** Crystal Thurn, Pastor Erika Lenth, Danielle Friedlein, Lois Garms, Ashley Blietz-Camp, Justin Birdnow, Steve Johnson, Kevin Brainard, Barbara Horns, Craig Watson, Beth Foels. Absent: Andy Meyer, Tiffany Torkelson

Meeting called to order by council President, Crystal Thurn, at 6:31 pm. Devotions were led by Lois Garms. Next month is Tiffany Torkelson.

**Minutes of Council Meeting:** Minutes from the February 13th council meeting were reviewed. Justin Birdnow motioned to approve the minutes as printed. Steve Johnson seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report & Bills: Danielle shared that we brought in \$14,740.90 more than we spent in February. \$38,224.59 has been moved to the new Current Fund Holding account, leaving our checking account balance at \$15,000.00. Memorials received totaled \$1,078.95 with \$65.00 being In Loving Memory memorials. Memorial fund expenses for February included \$537.14 for the Carillon amplifier repair and \$210.07 for stained glass window supplies. The Memorial Fund CD matures on March 20th and the interest earned, estimated at \$900, will be moved into Committee Choice. The CD will be renewed for another year at 4% interest. Our new even pay amount for Black Hills Energy will be \$776.00 and communion supplies have been ordered and will be reflected in March. Kevin Brainard motioned to approve the treasurer's report. Ashley Blietz-Camp seconded. Motion carried.

Correspondence: None.

Pastor's Report: Pastor reported mileage of 77 totalling \$53.90. Barbara Horns motioned to approve Pastor's mileage. Lois Garms seconded. Motion carried. Pastor has been busy visiting Garden View which is enjoyed by the residents. She has made some home visits and had three baptisms recently with two more upcoming. Pastor will preside at Elmer Marting's funeral on Saturday, March 22nd. She recently attended the SOTH assembly with Richard Sass, Craig Watson, and Bailey Engen. It was well attended by local congregations and the upcoming budget was passed. Pastor's six-week Bible study on the parables continues to go well, with 6-8 people attending each week. State Individual Speech is this coming Saturday with 29 entries participating.

**Education & Youth:** Met on February 17th and is looking into breaking up some combined grades to make more manageable class sizes for 2025-2026 and Heidi has received interest from few members to become Sunday School teachers.

Fellowship & Evangelism: No report

Mission & Social Ministry: No report

**Property & Grounds:** Met on February 23rd. Kevin gave an update on the ceiling tile and floor tile repairs. Justin received a quote for the retaining wall repair for \$3,000. Steve Johnson motioned to approve the repair of the east retaining wall. Craig Watson seconded. Motion carried. Updates were also given on the parsonage's new front door, the office's air conditioning, and sidewalk repairs. Justin is still waiting for an estimate on asphalt for the parking lot. Total project costs discussed range from \$8,800 to \$12,000.

**Old Business:** Signage on the display entering Monona, cost will be between \$60-\$70 per sign and will be made by Schultz Sign Company. Lois Garms motioned that we purchase two signs for the display. Kevin Brainard seconded. Motion carried.

**New Business:** Denise Schutte has given her two weeks notice, with her last day being Sunday, March 22nd. Denise's custodial position was from November to April with Kevin working the remaining months but the position will now be year round and open to congregation members first. The new custodian will be paid \$10.00 an hour for 20 hours a week. Kevin will create a weekly schedule and summer schedule.

Next Meeting will be Monday, April 7th at 6:30 pm

Steve Johnson motioned to adjourn the meeting at 7:19 pm. Kevin Brainard seconded. Motion carried.

# The Church Custodian Position Is Open

Part-time, salaried position of about 20 hours per week (Schedule is flexible, but some weekend hours may be required)

The Church Custodian's responsibilities include cleaning and maintaining the church for regular and special events. This includes:

- General cleaning
- Deep cleaning
- Washing and waxing the floors
- Vacuuming the carpets and rugs
- Set-up and clean-up for regular church events and special events, such as dinners, weddings and funerals
- Monitoring and reporting supplies needed
- Basic maintenance of some church equipment

## Church Custodian Requirements:

- High School diploma or equivalent
- Be able to pass pre-employment background checks
- Be able to lift up to 75 lbs and bulky items
- Be a self-starter, as this is a fairly independent position
- Be responsible for safe cleaning of the building
- Must be able to communicate with staff and the public as needed


