Our weather has been hot one week and cold another. There has been tornadoes, hail, wind and flooding throughout the United States. Even the Bible has a lot of weather references; there are Scriptures that use weather to describe the coming of Jesus, Luke 21:25 'There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves.' 

REGULAR MEETING MINUTES St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Meeting May 14, 2024

(The May Minutes are printed but pending approval at the June 11th Council Meeting)

Present: Crystal Thurn, Pastor Erika Lenth, Danielle Friedlein, Lois Garms, Steve Johnson, Justin Birdnow, Ashley Blietz-Camp, Kevin Brainard, Beth Foels, Rein Kregel, and Craig Watson. Absent: Tiffany Torkelson, Andy Meyer, and Barbara Horns

Meeting called to order by council President, Crystal Thurn, at 6:01 pm. Devotions were led by Pastor Erika. Next month is Kevin Brainard.

Minutes of Council Meeting: Minutes from the April 7th council meeting were reviewed and one spelling correction was noted. Kevin Brainard motioned to approve the minutes with the correction. Steve Johnson seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report & Bills: Danielle shared that we brought in \$2,064.77 more than spent in April. Memorials received totaled \$2,668.80 with \$515.00 being In Loving Memory memorials. Expenses from Memorial accounts included \$600 towards the principal of the solar loan and \$655.12 for stained glass window repairs. Special offering received through May 11th for SOTH has brought in \$4,175.00 and we will continue to collect through May. Summer office hours will be Monday-Thursday 8:30 am to 1:30 pm and the office will be closed on Fridays. Steve Johnson motioned to approve the treasurer's report. Ashley Blietz-Camp seconded. Motion carried.

Correspondence: Letters were received from Pastor Margaret and Heather Hageman from SOTH both concerning ConFest, thanking us for a fun and very well put together event and great meal. Danielle also received a phone call from Mrs. Schellhorn's high school Leadership class, asking for permission to clean headstones at the cemetery.

Pastor's Report: Pastor reported mileage of 156 totaling \$109.20 for April through the first week in May. Justin Birdnow motioned to approve Pastor's mileage. Kevin Brainard seconded. Motion carried. Pastor shared that her visits to Garden View continue to go well and she visited Stan Klotbach at Northgate in Waukon. She presented awards & scholarships for the Senior Awards Night last week and attended Day of Renewal at EWALU with other area pastors. ConFest went well and was attended by 16 youth and 11 adults. A meal was served and everyone enjoyed the games, especially the escape rooms. Baccalaureate is tonight.

Education & Youth: No report

Fellowship & Evangelism: No report

Mission & Social Ministry: Held Progressive supper on May 4th and everyone had a great time! Next meeting is June 1st after church.

Property & Grounds: Kevin has completed the parsonage deck and shared pictures.

Stewardship & Finance: No report

Worship & Music: Met May 13th. Summer worship dates will be June 22nd, July 6th, August 3rd, and September 7th. Pastor will be gone August 3rd so it will be a lay service and we will start using the blue binder for music. We have 4 upcoming baptisms. Crystal has gotten a quote from AEL for a chair lift for the balcony.

Interchurch Council: Baccalaureate is being held at Giard Methodist tonight. Next meeting is set for June 30th.

Old Business: Signage for Monona display at Gateway park: Signs are finished and will be displayed soon. Discussion was also held on updating our other signs at town entrance. Parsonage door: Is in and should be installed in the next two weeks. Custodial position: One application has been received. Steve Johnson motioned to offer the custodial position to the applicant on the basis the applicant accepts the position. Justin Birdnow seconded. Motion carried. Wage and hours were then discussed and Lois Garms motioned the position to pay \$12.50 an hour for 10-15 hours a week. Justin Birdnow seconded. Motion carried. Smart TVs for SS Department & Library: Have been paid for and will be reflected in May financial report. Electrical Inspection: Wade Kregel completed inspection citing a few updates are needed. Estimate for updates is \$1,006.20 which includes the church and parsonage and can be completed in the coming weeks. Kevin Brainard motioned to have Wade make the necessary repairs. Craig Watson seconded. Motion carried.

New Business: Parking Lot Resurfacing: We have received two quotes for this project from Kluesner and Strub Blacktopping. To make both estimates equally comparable, Kluesner will resubmit the bid to match the specifications given by Strub. Chair Lift to Balcony: The estimates Crystal received from AEL include two different weight capacities, 300lbs and 400lbs. The first quote was \$4995 and the other was \$6250. Discussion was held and the council asked for a few specific questions to be answered before moving forward. Crystal will email those questions and pass along information to the council.

Next Meeting will be Wednesday, June 11th at 6:00 pm

Ashley Blietz-Camp motioned to adjourn the meeting at 7:35 pm. Kevin Brainard seconded. Motion carried.


