# From Pastor Erika

Lent is upon us, beginning with Ash Wednesday on March 5th. It brings to mind what will I give up this year? Will I give anything up? Giving something up during the 40 days of Lent is something personal; this is about your journey with God and strengthening your faith. So why do we give things up? We are replicating Jesus' sacrifice and withdrawal to the wilderness where he was tempted by Satan for 40 days. Many people give something up for self-sacrifice and to resist temptation as Jesus resisted temptation. Giving something up for 40 days is a way to start a new habit. Before Lent begins there is Shrove Tuesday, also called Fat Tuesday, it's a day of penitence, to clean the soul, and a day of celebration as the last chance to feast before Lent begins. This is the day where people eat and use up the foods or things that they will give up for Lent because food isn't to be wasted. Shrove Tuesday is a penitential day meaning it's the start of your reflection of yourself, many people would confess their sins to their pastor and receive absolution of their guilt. We will celebrate Fat Tuesday with our taco supper on March 4th. Lent is a solemn time that we reflect on how we have sinned against God and each other. Many people use Lent as a time to repair those relationships. As Jesus was in the wilderness for 40 days being tempted, we too are in the wilderness. We have been in the wilderness of a pandemic for 2 years, our journey through life is full of wilderness moments. During our Lenten Wednesday worship services, we will explore the topic Turning Toward God's Abundance. I love Lent because even though it is such a somber time, it is also a time that our faith is reinvigorated. We cling to God's promise, "I am about to do a new thing, now it springs, forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." (Isaiah 43:19) This Lent, we trust together that even now God is making a way in the wilderness, leading us toward that future and inviting us to inspire hope and courage along the way.



# Council Meeting February 13, 2025

Meeting called to order by council President, Crystal Thurn at 6:30 pm. Devotions were led by Steve Johnson. Next month is Lois Garms.

**Minutes of Council Meeting:** Minutes from the January 19th council meeting were reviewed. Andrew Meyer motioned, Justin Birdnow seconded, to approve the minutes as printed. Motion carried.

Treasurer Reports & Bills: Danielle Shared that January expenses were a bit more than what we took in. However; the first week in February we brought in some larger donations from people who pay annually and quarterly. All in all we're in good shape. The Memorial Fund CD of \$18,000.00 will be up for renewal in March. Current interest rate for a 1 year CD is 4.00%. A motion was made by Kevin Brainard to place the interest earned from the current CD into Committee Choice and to renew the \$18,000.00 CD for one year. Craig Watson, seconded. Motion Passed.

**Correspondence:** One elderly Parishioner verbally noted they were thankful for the online services. It is becoming more difficult for them to come to services.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor shared she had visited Garden View. There are two baptisms in February. One was last weekend and another this weekend. More of them are scheduled in March and April .There is one wedding coming up in October. There are 6 kids in Confirmation and all is going well. Started Bible Study last week and had 8 people in attendance. There are 3 more weeks and are held at 10:15 in the church library.

**Education and Youth:** No Update. They have a Meeting Monday February 17th.

Fellowship & Evangelism: Have not met.

Mission & Social Ministry: Have not met.

**Property & Grounds:** Have not met.

**Stewardship & Finance:** Met Monday February 10th. Selected new officers. Several projects were discussed that need to be completed. It was decided to ask the council if these funds could be set aside so we can complete them in the near future.

Worship and Music: Next meeting March 11th @ 6:15.

**Interchurch Council:** Met at St John's in Farmersburg on January 27th.. Baccalaureate will be held at the United Methodist Church in Giard on May 14th. The Goodwill truck will be here on May 10th in the Community Center Parking.

# Council Minutes, continued . . .

**Old Business:** The new Carillon amplifier has been installed in the bell tower. However, the touch screen that controls the bells is not working. Ryan Martindale is contacting the company to help trouble-shoot what needs to be done with the touch screen.

**New Business:** There was discussion about the many projects we're working on that have not yet been completed and paid for. They include fixing of the sidewalks, parsonage door, office air conditioner, retaining wall and curb, and stripping and sealing the red tile floors. Some of the funds for these are coming from the monies we have in our general or current fund. Because they're not complete and some will take a bit time to complete and there is concern we could possibly "double spend" the money. After discussion, Crystal Thurn made a motion to move all but \$15,000.00 from the Current Fund Checking into a "Current Fund Holding Account" in the Memorial Savings account. Kevin Brainard seconded. Motion passed. This money is still considered current fund money and will be accessible for current expenses, as needed.

Next Meeting will be Monday March 10th @ 6:30 pm.

Meeting adjourned at 7:35 pm.

Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.


