#### From Pastor Erika

Summer is a time for conferences and camp. Many of us get to do these activities this summer or some time in our lives have done them. This is a busy summer in the life of our congregation and the ELCA. In June was the Synod Assembly in Cedar Falls that Celia Brown, Wren Feuerhelm & I attended. In July, I will take 7th & 8th graders to Camp EWALU. At the end of July, I and delegates from all over the United States and Puerto Rico will gather in Phoenix, AZ for the ELCA Churchwide Assembly where a new presiding bishop and secretary will be elected. These are just some of the conferences I know about and you all have your own for your work or activities you belong to. Why do we do these activities? Jesus said, 'Truly I tell you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or fields, for my sake and for the sake of the good news, who will not receive a hundredfold now in this age houses, brothers and sisters, mothers and children, and fields, with persecutions and in the age to come eternal life." (Mark 10:29-30) Jesus wants his followers to leave everything to follow him. Going to conferences or camps are a very small way to leave everything but I still believe it is a way to follow Jesus. Jesus wants us to leave everything to get out of our comfort zone and see the world God made and what life is like outside of our context, how other people live, what needs there are and how others express their faith in the Triune God. I am so glad that camp is a requirement of confirmation. I never had the opportunity to go to camp but many of my classmates in seminary were counselors and they have stories that will last a lifetime. All of the students I have taken to camp since I've been here still tell stories of their time at camp. Their time at camp is a week that is set apart to be with God, to be in relationship with people, to be changed. Camp, the Youth Gatherings, WELCA Gatherings, Churchwide Assembly and Synod Assembly are opportunities to strengthen your faith, see the world through a new lens and be immersed in God.

Camps & conferences aren't all work there is a lot of fun that happens too and challenging and encouraging yourself and others. Not all of you will have the opportunity to go to camp or one of these conferences but you are still very much a part of making this happen for others through your donations, attending meals sponsored by Confirmation students and Luther League, donating quilts to the auctions at camps to keep their ministry going, praying for those who go, asking questions, and looking at pictures. I am grateful for all your support with these ministries, they are so important to the faith lives of the Body of Christ. Thanks be to God for these opportunities and for you dear brothers and sisters in Christ who continue to support these ministries!

#### REGULAR MEETING MINUTES St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Meeting June 11, 2025

(The June Minutes are printed but pending approval at the July 16th Council Meeting)

**Present:** Crystal Thurn, Pastor Erika Lenth, Danielle Friedlein, Steve Johnson, Justin Birdnow, Kevin Brainard, Lois Garms, Barbara Horns, Rein Kregel, Beth Foels

Absent: Ashley Bietz-Camp, Tiffany Torkelson, Andy Meyer, Craig Watson

Meeting called to order by council Vice President, Kevin Brainard at 6 p.m. Crystal arrived and took over about 6:15 p.m.

Devotions were led by Kevin Brainard. Next month is Andy Meyer.

**Minutes of Council Meeting:** Minutes from the May 14th council meeting were reviewed. Motion by Justin Birdnow, Barbara Horns seconded, to approve the minutes as printed. Motion carried.

Treasurer Reports & Bills: Danielle shared both attendance and offering were down in May. We spent \$7,602.07 more than we brought in however, \$3,000.00 was for the retaining wall project and \$390.00 for Synod Assembly fees. Memorial Fund brought in \$919.01 with \$60.00 being In Loving Memory memorials. Expenses from Memorial accounts included \$1,057.98 from SS school fund for purchase of Tv's to be used in Sunday School, \$12.83 for Stained glass window supplies, \$1,540.00 for remaining Confirmation Camp fees, and \$4,375.00 from Bell Choir, Choir Funds and Committee Choice for down payment on balcony chair lift. \$3,000.00 was moved from Current Fund Holding to pay for the retaining wall project. This is the start of the renewed Church Insurance policy with Church Mutual. We paid the umbrella and worker's comp in full for the year along with our regular monthly premium for a total of \$1,220.29. Monthly Marco bill for copier increased by \$8.56 because of Tariff and inflationary costs.

Special offering during the month of May for Shepard of The Hills Building Fund Totaled \$4,703.00.

Erin Schultz started as our new custodian on June 1st.

Kristen Zabel is one of our new Sunday School teachers and would like to paint some murals in the Nursery Dept. Motion made by Justin Birdnow to allow Kristen to pain in the Nursery Room area, seconded by Steve Johnson. Motion carried.

Looking ahead, the office will be closed Thursday June 19th. The week of July 28th Pastor will be in AZ for a Churchwide Assembly. That is also Clayton County Fair week. Danielle is a 4H leader so the office will bel closed on Tuesday and Thursday. She will be in the office at normal hours on Monday and Wednesday. Motion to accept the Treasurer's Report by Steve Johnson, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Justin Birdnow. Motion carried.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor reported 306 miles totaling \$214.20 for May. Barbara Horns motioned to approve mileage. Steve Johnson seconded. Motion carried. She attended the Baccalaureate, visited Gail Bissell and performed two Baptisms. There will be two more next month and possibly two more in the near future. She, Celia Brown and Wren Fuerhelm attended the NEIA Synod Assembly in Cedar Falls.

**Education and Youth:** The 7th and 8th graders will help plant trees later this fall. We have teachers for all age groups. There will be a lot of changes and moving around downstairs utilizing more class rooms.

**Fellowship & Evangelism:** New signs with church logo will go up out on the business billboard by Gateway Park this week. New signs will also be put up on the west entrance road and on the east road coming into town. Next meeting later this month.

Mission & Social Ministry: On Sunday July 20th @ 4 p.m. will be our movie night with a light Potluck Supper beforehand.

#### Council Minutes, continued ...

**Property & Grounds:** Met Sunday June 8th. Went over the project list of items being worked on. Parsonage door complete, Parsonage Deck complete, and Retaining Wall complete. Stripping and sealing of red tile floors will begin about July 1st. Talked about resurfacing the parking lot as the next main project to continue to work on. Motioned by Steve Johnson to move forward with exploring resurfacing the parking lot and to bring it to the Congregation in September, seconded by Rein Kregel. Motion Carried. We hope to get all bids finalized in the coming months. Tentatively September 21st will be our Congregation Meeting with notice of this meeting being presented on Sept 7th and 14th. We will also put it into our Church Newsletter.

**Stewardship & Finance:** We will have a meeting before next month's council meeting to go over the 1st half financials and give a report at the council meeting.

Worship and Music: None

**Interchurch Council:** Meeting scheduled for June 30th.

Old Business: Signage should be up by this weekend

Parsonage door is complete

Electrical inspection and repairs were completed by Kregel Electric.

Chair lift to balcony will be installed this summer.

New Business: Sunday school space/basement tour

We toured the basement to see what we could do with some of the "stuff" that is down there in various areas in order to open up a couple of more rooms to accommodate our growing Sunday School classes. It was decided to have several key people be contacted and help decide what to do with some of it. At this time our thoughts are to have an auction. Rein Kregel volunteered to lead the auction. Items that we're keeping will be consolidated into rooms or closets in different areas.

Office air conditioner. We received a bid from Wirkler Bros. to replace the condenser in the unit for the offices of \$3,300.00. We'll talk with a couple of people to see if they can get the old unit down and the new unit up on the roof. Motion made by Lois Garms seconded by Steve Johnson to replace the condenser. Motion carried.

Next Meeting will be Wednesday July 16th, 6:00 p.m..

Steve Johnson motioned to adjourn at 7:07pm. Barbara Horns seconded. Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.


