

Devotion

When the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, God saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of God's mercy. God saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom God poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by God's grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life. Titus 3:4-7 [NIV]

There is a story from a man who had gone to visit his uncle in Ireland. One morning they got up early to watch the sun rise over a lake as they celebrated the man's 80th birthday. They were in silence, and the nephew noticed his uncle had a radiant smile. The nephew asked, "Can you tell me why you are so happy?" "Yes, lad," the uncle replied, "You see, the Father is very fond on me. Ah, me Father is so very fond on me!"

Do you believe that God is very fond of you? Are you aware of how very fond God is of your life?

There are many affirmations we learn about God through the resurrection of Jesus that we will celebrate at Easter. One of those affirmations Jesus had taught was that God is truly very fond of each person. You may have trouble believing that God is very fond of you. You may question that truth because of events that have happened in your life, or because of how you may have lived. You may not accept this fact.

Regardless of the events that have occurred in your life, both good and bad, the assurance we find through Jesus' teachings, and that you and I might experience through God's spirit being with us, is that God is very fond of each one of us!

God's fondness for us applies to us, even when our ways of living have hurt us, others, and God. God's love and kindness for us leads God to be merciful toward us. God's mercy comes to us because God is a God of hope. God is gracious to us because God wants us to become heirs of God.

Jesus was willing to go to the cross so that through the way he suffered we may be made even more aware of the importance of his resurrection. We learn that God's mercy is connected with God's power over sin and over death. God has the power to save us, and to also give us the gift of life everlasting.

Why would God want to save us after what humans do to one another?

Because you and I have been created in God's image! We have the ability to love and to be influences for good upon others. We have the potential to live forever, and God wants us to share in thankful fellowship with God and with those who are a part of God's kingdom.

Easter is an event that gives us the assurance that we can believe in God's love for us and in God's power to save us. Blessed are we when we acknowledge our value to God! Blessed are we when we seek to live so that we know of God's spirit that is with us. Blessed are we when we strive to live for the benefits of God's kingdom.
