

Devotion

As I lie in bed, I remember You; all night long I think of You, because You have always been my help. In the shadow of Your wings I sing for joy. I cling to You, and Your hand keeps me safe.

Psalm 63: 6-8. [TEV]

There are many images that are used for God, for God responds toward people in so many different ways. In Psalm 63, David pictures God as a bird who uses it wings to cover and protect its young. A helpful, encouraging understanding about God is that of God seeking to care for us and protect us from danger, as a bird seeks to care for her young.

David seeks to "hold on" to God, for in "God's hand" David understands
God will keep him safe, even in times of danger. David expresses his faith in
God, due to God's goodness to him in the past,
for God has always been his help.

I believe our faith is one of the most important assets we possess. Faith gives us security to live into the future as we understand God is with us.

We could easily allow ourselves to become immobilized, and afraid to even walk across the street, if we spent time considering all that might potentially happen to harm us. We trust our eyesight. We trust our ability to walk. We trust our judgment of the danger of traffic. After looking both ways and seeing the road is clear, we walk across the street.

Devotion

We have come to trust our physical senses, and have faith to believe we can make good judgments based upon them. We often find it harder to trust our spiritual senses, for too often we have failed to develop them so that we feel secure to trust God as we live into an unknown future. It is easy to find ourselves frightened by the unknown and the unexpected that is before us, unless we have learned to trust in God's guidance and care, and as we seek to live just, righteous, compassionate lives.

As people of faith, we are to remember how God has been at work in our past, even in difficult and uncertain times, to bring us through. We are called to take shelter in God's love, and strive to determine what God would have us do in this present time as we seek to live by Jesus' teachings for us.

Our calling as people of faith is to strive to live this way each day that comes our way. In routine days, we normally feel we can use our own desires and wishes to make our decisions. Yet sometimes these end up causing us problems. We would be wiser to seek God's guidance every day as we abide by Jesus' teachings and strive to live in fellowship with God.

Often people's approach toward God is to only seek God's wisdom when their own experience and knowledge fail to offer them the help they need. Too often people only turn to God when the future looks bleak and the desire is for God to get them out of difficulties they may have brought on themselves by their habits and desires of life.

Wise are we, and enabled to grow in our faith in God, as we decide to be faithful to Jesus' teachings, and live each day striving to know that God is with us. God is with us to aid us – and God can help us make it – all the way into God's eternal home.
