Devotion

They say that the first step to recovery is admitting that you have a problem. OK, I may have a problem. I have a slight compulsion to purchase fancy high-tech flashlights. My heart jumps whenever I see an ad for a new model from O LIGHT, WARSUN, or WUBEN.



Of course, the algorithms behind all of my social media accounts know this about me and feed me a constant supply of bright shiny things to distract me.
