

Devotion



I think I might have to title this regular space: "Musings from the Back Porch." It seems like I do much of my creative thinking sitting on the back porch. I have previously mentioned that the back of our house faces east, so sunrises can be spectacular. Recently I decided to take advantage of the situation and record a time-lapse video. I got up extra early and eagerly made my way through deep morning darkness, navigating family room furniture, to set up my camera. I found a good mounting point on the porch railing, ran a long USB-C cord so I wouldn't run out of battery, synced everything to my phone, and waited. All of the preparations had been made; I even had my cozy hooded cardigan to keep me warm. I was ready. The sun, however, was not. As much as I longed to see the arrival of the sun, I still had to wait.

Sound familiar? It's a fairly good metaphor for the Liturgical Season of Advent, in which we collectively prepare for God to make himself known through Jesus, the Christ, the Messiah. It is a season of anticipation, a four-week period for us to ready ourselves for God's presence in our midst, for the Kindom of God to manifest itself fully in our lives.

Devotion

We sing hymns like "Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus," we pray daily devotions, we mark the days on our Advent calendars. We hold our spiritual breath as we prepare to see a new thing.

It's an odd time; a time when we balance our upcoming celebration of that birth in Bethlehem over 2000 years ago with our longing to see Jesus return in an advent yet to come. We hold the past and the future in tension during Advent.

I knew as I sat wrapped up in my sweater, that the sunrise would come. The sun had come up yesterday, and the day before. Still, this one was going to be special because I was present for it. I was fully there, fully engaged in the moment — open for what the new day would bring. As I gazed out across the tree line at the gradually brightening sky, I could see evidence of what was coming, but still I had to wait.

Obviously, the sunrise came, I got my shot, and the day went on, but I had been changed through my perseverance.

And so, as much as we long for the arrival of the Son, we must wait. I promise you: the wait will be worth it.
