When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, what is mankind that you are mindful of them, human beings that you care for them? You have made them a little lower than the angels and crowned them with glory and honor.

Psalm 8:3-5 [NIV]

Gregory of Nyssa, a 4th century bishop, wrote, "Know to what extent the creator has honored you above all the rest of creation. You alone have been made in the image of the reality that transcends all understanding, the likeness of imperishable beauty, the imprint of true divinity, the recipient of beatitude, the seal of the true light. When you turn to Him you become that which He is Himself... There is nothing so great among beings that it can be compared with Your greatness. God is able to measure the whole heaven with His span. The earth and the sea are enclosed in the hollow of His hand. And although He is so great and holds all creation in the palm of His hand, you are able to hold Him, He dwells in you and moves within you without constraint, for he has said, 'I will live and move among them'

(II Corinthians 6:16)."


Community Engagement

MAY MISSION PROJECT FOR FIRST CHRISTIAN UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST

The Board of Deacons has voted to have our May Mission project to be financial support for Benevolence Farms, which is located in the southern part of Alamance County. We are doing this in conjunction with Life's Journey UCC, who is sponsoring an outdoor event on Saturday, June 14, 2025 in their church yard in behalf of Benevolence Farms. See additional information below about this event.

The quote below is from the Benevolence Farm website, as they seek to help women who have been in prison to readjust to society.

"At Benevolence Farm, we believe that we are more than our worst mistakes. We all have the right to safety, housing, food, healing, and connection rooted in dignity and self-autonomy."

"Our flagship program — transitional housing and employment — provides a space for women and gender expansive people returning home from prison and jail to process, heal, and prepare for what's next in a rural setting surrounded by nature. Benevolence Farms is one of the few places across the state that accepts people of all criminal convictions. After each person's arrival, they set their own goals and staff works alongside them to identify the right resources to succeed. Because each resident leads the way in their reentry, we see about 15% of our alumni return to incarceration within two years, and almost all who are reincarcerated are for a technical violation regarding their probation or parole. Ultimately, we hope to measure the extent to which our alumni thrive in — and with — their communities of choice."

First Christian's Mission Project in May is for monetary donations to be made to help these women become positive contributors to society. Checks can be made out to First Christian UCC and designated for Benevolence Farms. They should be turned in by the first of June.
