Message from Dorothy Gates—General Manager

The year 2021 has been a busy year for us all. We had a very active monsoon this year that wreaked havoc through our community and our crews worked overtime cleaning up debris. Santa Rita Landscaping is now spraying weeds and hopefully we will have that under control soon. Marcos started his own company and left Villas West the end of the year. We wish him only the best in this business endeavor. We have hired Santa Rita Landscape to take over the regular ground maintenance. Humberto remains on staff to handle the mowing, irrigation, work orders and erosion control.

We replaced 3 roofs in 2021 and have budgeted for 10 roofs this year. The Board has decided to use a roofer who applies a polyurethane roof opposed to a buildup roof. The foam is lighter weight, adds another layer of insulation, quicker to apply and lower in price. The foam can be sprayed on existing roofs that do not have severe damage or that are not TPO. There is a 10 year warranty on installation. The roofs will need re-coating after 10 years and every 5 years thereafter. I was told that we can realistically expect 30 years from these roofs!

Due to the extremely high number of HVAC replacements this year, I have instituted a halt on automatic replacements. Our techs are capable of repairing and recharging units if needed. If we are unable to repair or it continues to be an issue, it will be replaced.

Sewers continue to cause problems however the number of calls have lessened. We continue to add cleanouts when needed and remove oleanders when deemed detrimental to the sewer line.

General Manager—Continued

Our crews are removing oleanders when time permits for those not causing an immediate issue. One of our biggest problems with the sewers is the use of wipes. Please remember there are NO good wipes for our sewer system and that they do not degrade. They cause issues with not only you, they can also cause backups in other units around you.

We have budgeted for the painting of 26 units. We are hoping to get that started soon. I will also try and get a bid for the painting of the curbs and parking stalls. We no longer have a finance employee. We have turned over the bookkeeping to an accountant and this will be a big help for us and lowers our payroll and insurance costs.

There was \$15.00 increase in the monthly assessments bringing us up to \$235.00 which is still less than Villas East and a steal for all the services you receive. I have been notified of several compliance issues and I am asking you all to take more care in how we present our property, look around your villa and make sure you are in compliance with all regulations and if you see something needing repair or work, notify the office .

Board of Directors

President-Chris Fisher

For Villas West, 2021 was a year of changes, extremes, and opportunities. Some were subtle, while others made an immediate and lasting mark to our community.

The Association hired Dorothy Gates as General Manager, a decision that was quite simple to make and is paying dividends already. She brings years of experience with the Villas to her position and has a genuine love for the community and its people. Dorothy wants people to love living here as much as she loves working here. Her idea of reviving a Villas West Christmas Parade was a treat for all and just an example of her vision for Villas West. Plans are in the works for more social activities and opportunities to get out with our neighbors and enjoy the beauty around us.

With Dorothy's promotion to General Manager, it created a vacancy in the Bookkeepers Office. We were already working with a local CPA firm (Epic Business Solutions.) to do our 2020 Financial Review and in discussions they suggested that they could be an economical alternative to hiring another part-time bookkeeper. The Association can be assured that the Board takes its fiscal responsibilities seriously and this was the logical and prudent decision.

The Board welcomed three new members after two previous Directors sold their Villas and the third stepped down. Kermit, Lou, and Lila stepped up to serve the remaining terms of those that left, and their participation is appreciated and admired. With the previous Board President leaving, I was elected President by the Board, a position I humbly accepted and its opportunity to help keep the Villas the beautiful and historic neighborhood it's been for over 50 years.

President—Continued

The Villas has been blessed with dedicated and hardworking employees in the Landscaping and Maintenance departments, but there was a change there, too. Our shop foreman, Marcos, made the decision to start his own landscaping company, and took most of our landscapers with him. As a result, the Association contracted with an outside landscaping company, resulting in a savings in payroll, taxes, insurance, as well as equipment purchases and repairs. It comes at the cost of the familiar faces we used to see maintaining our grounds, though.

There are other noticeable improvements as well. Paseos Sarta, Tierra, and Camino Penasco were chip sealed, which was sorely needed. Gone are the old swamp coolers in the laundry rooms, replaced with mini-split A/C units. The fence around the recycle area was taken down and a brick wall was built by our masons; the wall is aesthetically pleasing and provides some extra security to the area.

2021 wasn't without its challenges,. Record heat in June contributed to the 90 HVAC units needing replacement last year, more than double number budgeted. July, the wettest month ever in the valley, and the reported 17 inches of rain that month took its toll on our roofs. For the year, the Association replaced three roofs and performed 57 roof repairs, again far exceeding the Budget. We can't control Mother Nature, though, and included in the benefits of living in the Villas West are that the roofs and HVACs are the responsibility of the Association, requiring the Board to approve these expenses. As a result, more money was withdrawn from the Reserve and Major Maintenance account to cover these amounts. The roads project, a Reserve expense, also contributed to the reduction in our Reserves.

The Board and General Manager are working diligently to save money grow the Reserve Fund without sacrificing the health, safety, or pleasure of our Residents.

The year 2021 brought the Association news that the Villas, both West and East, have been chosen to receive the National Heritage Award, given by Associated Realty of America, "In recognition of the care and concern to preserve and protect a National Treasure." This award is given to historically documented properties which, by their unique qualities, are a major cut above surrounding properties and have maintained their original distinctive features. The Villas were designed and created by Don Maxon in the 1960's and are based on his visit to the 339-year-old Mexican Colonial community of Alamos, Sonora, Mexico. As a National Heritage Award winning site, this designation will increase the inherent value of our community and should elevate the pride of those living here. There is no cost for this award, and it does not place any restrictions on the property, unlike a National Historic Site. The main advantage is that the Villas will maintain decision-making power regarding major architectural changes to properties, thus preserving the look and feel for the uniqueness of Villas West.

The Presentation Ceremony will be held at the GVR East Center, 7 S Abrego Drive, on Thursday, March the third at 2:00 PM. The ceremony is open to the public and I'm encouraging you to attend in support of Villas West, its history, and its contribution to the community of Green Valley. You will be getting more information as it develops.


Heritage Committee

Cactus Care Instructions:

70 Degrees

Water every 3 weeks

80 Degrees

Water every 2 weeks

90 + Degrees

Water once, every week

December and January no water

Fertilize monthly

March – August

- 1/2 TBSP per gallon of water
- Treat for grubs and insects in spring and fall with a systemic insecticide, and fertilizer.
- Most cactus is hardy to 25 degrees. Cover the tops of the plant to protect the growth areas on the nights of the freeze.
- Do not leave the cover on for the whole season

A Solution for Wildcat Dumping

For years the Villas staff has picked up lawn clippings as a courtesy to our residents. Clippings were to be bagged or boxed for easy handling. In the past many items have been placed on the curb for pickup by our staff that are not clippings.

Beginning on February 28 we will be picking up lawn clippings and debris that is bagged or boxed on **Monday** and **Thursday** only. Please place items at the curb by 1:00pm on the day of pickup only. Reducing the days of pick up to two days will free our staff to do other tasks. It will also cut down the cost of fuel.

With the decrease in pickups (plant clippings only), we will now offer a once a month pick up for **small** landfill items. **(No furni-ture or lawn furniture)** This will be on the third Friday of each month. You must sign up with the office and pay **a fee of \$5.00**. The funds collected will be used to defer the cost of the dump fees.

The office and crew hope this policy will benefit our residents and decrease the items placed on curbs, deterring from the beautiful grounds we enjoy in the Villas.

Dogs love hiking and you are welcome to bring your dog along. All dogs must be on a leash for the their safety (It is a Pima County law) Bring water and a bowl, needle-nose pliers or a comb for removing cholla pups from their paws.
