Message from Dorothy Gates—General Manager

For those who have not been in the office I would like to introduce Liliana Ortega our Admin Assistant. She is a true blessing to Villas West and such an asset to have in the office. Thank you Liliana for all you do.

I have looked at our delinquencies and it looks like we have 5 accounts past 90 days, unfortunately I know that three of the owners are deceased and we are waiting on Estate docs.

We have removed the chaise lounges from the pools due to the safety issue---people were falling through. I have looked into purchasing replacement fabric but
came across new lounges at a lower cost than the fabric so I will slowly be ordering
replacements and hope to have the pools furnished before summer. Speaking of
the pools, we had both North pools down for awhile awaiting parts. The North Pena
pool is back up and running. North Sarta has received new parts and awaiting a pilot. If the heater does not work after replacing the pilot, we will be looking at purchasing a new heater. We did have a pool tech who repairs pools with Leslie's and
he looked over the heaters and instructed us on what to do. There are pool covers
on order for these pools also. I have heard one is finished and they are waiting on
the second one. Once we receive them, the techs will get those installed.

We should be starting our annual painting in April. I currently have 21 buildings on the list for painting. I will look at adding more if funds allow. Our tech's are very busy and are doing roof cleaning and inspections as time allows. We are down two men right now so I am asking for some patience when it comes to non-emergency issues. I have hired one person to help Humberto and the Masons. This hopefully will allow them to get through the work orders faster.

I have had some complaints regarding the emailing of statements. We unfortunately had an update issue with Caliber (our software) which caused everyone to receive printed statements along with some being sent to past owners and tenants.

We have worked extremely hard on trying to get this bug cleared up and I think we are close. If you are getting mailed statements and prefer to receive email, please call the office to check and see if we have an OPT IN form on file.

As many of you are aware, I send out Friday updates. This seems to very popular and I hope to continue this. For those owners who do not have access to email, I print up these updates and have copies in the office. As much of the information in the updates pertain to things happening, please make your tenants aware of the printed updates also. I am a big fan of community and helping others.

I would like to take a moment and thank Lou Kifer in stepping up and creating a group called the Villas West Wanderers. Lou plans and guides some walks which she will get into more detail in her report . Thank you Lou!

I have received many suggestions in the past month's and you will soon see some things coming from those suggestions. One recent suggestion was a board where residents could post for jobs. For an example, you are a carpenter, you create a notice that you are available for work and we post it. If a resident is looking for a carpenter, we can direct them to your posting. I know we have many owners looking to stay busy and make some pocket money so I think this would be advantageous to our resident's. Grounds & Landscaping

Secretary—Lou Kifer

We are still experiencing colder than normal temperatures. Watering will resume when we no longer dip into the 30's at night. We have had a bit of rain to delay any routine for watering cactus. Keep in mind when the temps are in the 70's, water once every 3 weeks, in the 80's, once every 2 weeks and 90 and above once a week. Under watering is more beneficial than over watering. Fertilize now and then once a month until into Oct. Each watering is to be a long deep soak.

Plans are to create another cactus garden in a larger vacant area on Quinta and Penasco. The planning and development are being worked on at this time. We will design it to be aesthetically pleasing as well as presenting various cactus and native Sonoran Desert plants. Also, we are working on developing a community library kiosk in this area. These details are yet being work out with a grant for which we applied as well as building our own.

A request I have, I'd like volunteers who would be willing to do some planting and hauling of rocks. Some folks have purchased their own plants and are waiting to have them put into the ground. I will go with you to the property and give instructions. This way we can get the growing season established well before the heat of the summer hits.

The grounds committee and I will continue to water the cactus garden all summer. Feel free to water your common areas again keeping in mind the temperatures and monsoons. Remember a potted plant gets hotter and dries out sooner than one in the ground.

Maintenance

The Villas West Maintenance Advisory Committee met Tuesday, March 1, 2022 at the South Pena Pool. Attending the meeting were Chris Fisher, Mike Flynn, Dorothy Gates, Lou Kifer, Lila Szedlus, Jim Sullivan and myself. Mike Flynn and Lou Kifer were unable to attend the meeting. The next Villas West Maintenance Advisory Committee meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, April 5, 2022, at the South Pena Pool. While Villas West committee meetings are not public meetings, they are open to the public.

As of March 1, 2022 we have replaced 5 roofs. Roof inspections and regular maintenance continue to be a priority of the preventative maintenance plan.

Twenty-six buildings are scheduled to be repainted in 2022. We hope to get going on repainting the curbs and re-stenciling the parking stalls soon.

Dorothy continues to work on implementing a preventative maintenance plan; however, the main preventative maintenance plan priorities right now are checking on and cleaning roofs, cleaning and inspecting HVAC units, and removing Oleander shrubs that are creating issues with sewer blockages.

Discussions are occurring with the board and management of Villas East to see if the two associations can negotiate a joint agreement with Hamstra for HVAC unit needs to lower costs.

Dorothy and the maintenance crew are currently working on identifying areas of the sidewalks throughout Villas West that are considered "trip hazards" and will then be grinding those areas down to make them more safe for residents/visitors to walk on.

As of March 1, 2022 there have been a total of 469 work orders. Twenty-two of those work orders were roof related, 88 were HVAC related, 39 were water heater

related rerelated, 32 were sewer related and 53 were water turn on/off requests.

Budget & Finance

The Financial documents were not available at the time of publishing. They will be available on the website when they are updated.

AREA National Heritage Award Winner


Green Valley Villas, both East, and West, have been chosen as recipients of the National Heritage Award. This award is given to historically documented properties which, by their unique qualities, are a major cut above surrounding properties and have maintained their original distinctive features.

The Villas were designed and created by Don Maxon in the 1960's and are based on his visit to the 339-year old Mexican Colonial community of Alamos, Sonora, Mexico.

As a National Heritage Award winning site, this designation will increase the inherent value of our community and should elevate the pride of those living here. There is no cost for this award, and it puts us in some very prestigious company, including the original hotel in the Sonoma wine country town of Glen Ellen, the Chauvet.

The National Heritage Award should unite us all in a singular goal — to make the Villas the best it can be. If we all do our part, big or small, we can maintain the historic beauty of our community. And the bonus we will all enjoy is more unity by helping our community.

As of March 3rd our plaque is displayed in the office for all to see.



Cactus Care Instructions:

70 Degrees

Water every 3 weeks

80 Degrees

Water every 2 weeks

90 + Degrees

Water once, every week

December and January no water

Fertilize monthly

March – August

- 1/2 TBSP per gallon of water
- Treat for grubs and insects in spring and fall with a systemic insecticide, and fertilizer.
- Most cactus is hardy to 25 degrees. Cover the tops of the plant to protect the growth areas on the nights of the freeze.
- Do not leave the cover on for the whole season

A Solution for Wildcat Dumping

For years the Villas staff has picked up lawn clippings as a courtesy to our residents. Clippings were to be bagged or boxed for easy handling. In the past many items have been placed on the curb for pickup by our staff that are not clippings.

Beginning on February 28 we will be picking up lawn clippings and debris that is bagged or boxed on **Monday** and **Thursday** only. Please place items at the curb by 1:00pm on the day of pickup only. Reducing the days of pick up to two days will free our staff to do other tasks. It will also cut down the cost of fuel.


With the decrease in pickups (plant clippings only), we will now offer a once a month pick up for **small** landfill items. **(No furniture or lawn furniture)** This will be on the third Friday of each month. You must sign up with the office and pay **a fee of \$5.00**. The funds collected will be used to defer the cost of the dump fees.

The office and crew hope this policy will benefit our residents and decrease the items placed on curbs, deterring from the beautiful grounds we enjoy in the Villas.

Dump Run \$5.00 Fee Friday March 18th

- The third Friday of the month
- Call the office in advance to schedule
- The crew will only pick up boxed or bagged landscape debris on Mondays and Thursdays.
- All other debris must be held for the monthly dump run.

Take a hike—Meet new friends
