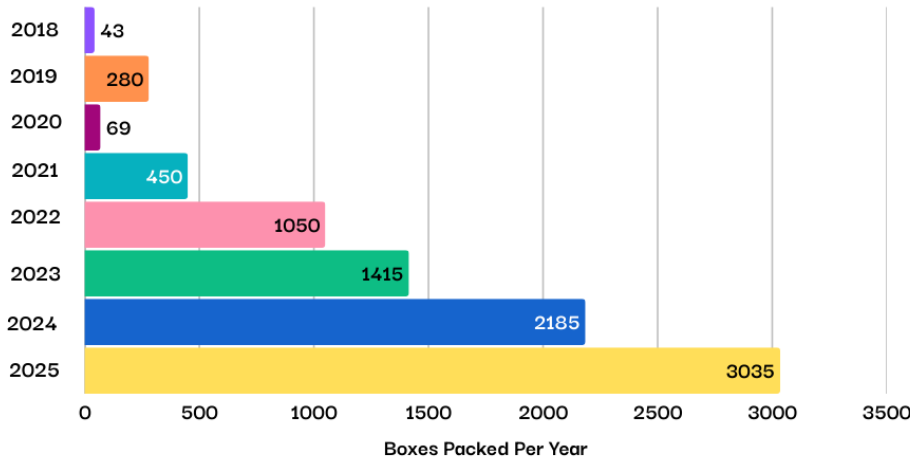

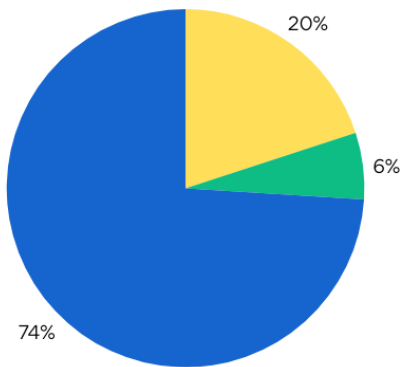

Boxes of Basics Packed Per Year



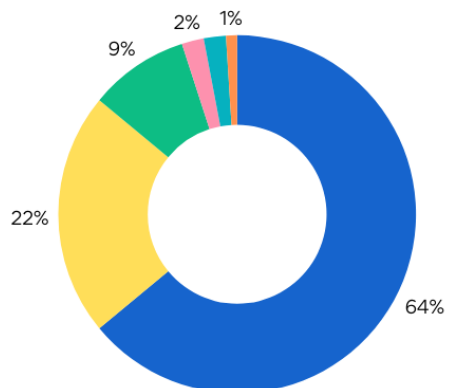
From 2024 to 2025, Boxes of Basics packed nearly 40% more boxes to meet growing community need.

Socioeconomic Indicators



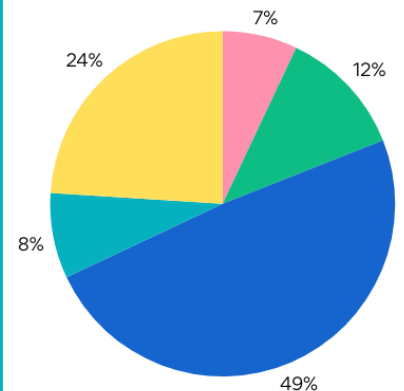
- Kids experiencing homelessness as defined by the McKinney Vento Assistance Act.

2025 HIGHLIGHTS & KEY TAKEAWAYS

Expanded support for children and families. Boxes of Basics significantly increased the number of boxes distributed, packing nearly **40%** more boxes than in 2024. This growth reflects increased operational capacity and rising demand for essential clothing support across the region.

Rising housing instability among children served. In 2025, **20%** of the children we served were experiencing homelessness, up from **12.4%** in 2024—an **61%+** year-over-year increase.

Expanded geographic reach. **Prince William County** remained the primary service area, with notable growth in **Fauquier** and **Warren counties**.

Served diverse children. Children served reflected the diversity of the region; **49%** identified as Hispanic/Latino, **24%** as Black, **12%** as White, **7%** as Asian, and **8%** as Other.

Diverted clothing from landfills. Boxes of Basics diverted more than **18 tons** of clothing from landfills in 2025—reducing textile waste while meeting essential clothing needs for children.

Activated the community. More than **900** unique volunteers contributed more than **4,300** hours in 2025, equaling a total value of more than **\$150,000** in volunteer time.

Strengthened community partnerships. Boxes of Basics worked with **168** referring partner organizations—including schools, nonprofits, community agencies, and faith-based organizations—to identify needs early, coordinate support, and connect children and families to essential resources across the region.
