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



Professional learning is most meaningful and useful when the experience results in ideas that can be easily implemented and leads to positive student outcomes. Kraft, Blazar and Hogan found significant evidence that high-quality instructional coaching showed gains equivalent to teacher experience learned over five to 10 years. There was also evidence of a value-added effect on student achievement from teachers who had a high-quality instructional coach.



Faculty meetings are opportunities to deliver short professional development that is impactful in cultivating a sense of community and raising the quality of instruction in the building.






