The West Africa ROOTS RECORD ROAD RALLY

What is the West Africa ROOTS RECORD ROAD RALLY (RRRR)?

The RRRR is a road rally designed to commemorate the 400th anniversary of the African Diaspora. The project will focus on visiting many of the slave trading museums, monuments and ports along the West Coast of Africa in January 2019. The mission is also designed to introduce the participant to the many cultures and people and to current development programs in West Africa. Visit Goree' Island, Kunta Kinte's Juffure, Freetown, Liberia, Cape Coast, Ouidah, Calabar, Douala and Libreville and learn about the Africa Agenda 2063.

A second overriding theme of the rally Is to connect with the many grassroots organizations working to improve the lives of people in Africa. As an exploration mission the RRRR draws on the expertise of The African Cultural Exchange in fostering cross-cultural interactions with people all around the continent of Africa. These interactions provide the framework for partnerships that lead to twoway benefit that are promoted by the United Nation's Sustainable Development Goal (SDG-17) -create Global Partnerships for sustainable development. Additionally the project will highlight other human development programs such as The Africa Agenda 2063, The New Urban Agenda, The ECOWAS Regional Integration Corridor and the WHO Health in all Policies to name a few. We invite all cross-cultural, developmental, educational and health care organizations working in Africa or other interested groups to join us on this exciting and enlightening road rally.
