BMSF Clinical Investigator Pipeline Program - Key Elements


Commitment	Provide immersive community-based experiences in clinical trial research to 250 medical students from groups underrepresented in medicine (50 per year).	
Program	6-week summer externship to learn the basics of clinical trials and effective community outreach, education, and engagement to increase diversity in clinical trials.	
Timeframe	June 13 - July 22, 2022; Scholars must be available to be on-site for the full 6-week program period.	
Award	\$5,000 Guidance for the award: The stipend is to cover travel, lodging, and living expenses during the externship.	
Externship Supervision	CIPP Students will be hosted by community-based clinical research organizations, such as CTSA and NCORP sites, and community health centers engaged in clinical research. Host sites receive grants of \$3,600/student.	
Locations	Atlanta, GA • New Orleans, LA • San Antonio, TX • Seattle, WA • St. Louis, MO	
Mentoring	BMSF Scholars will mentor CIPP Students, sharing their clinical research experiences and knowledge of clinical research career pathways.

CIPP Candidate Eligibility Criteria

Candidate Profile	 Eligible candidates will reflect the NMF definition of underrepresented in medicine: African American or Black Hispanic or Latino American Indian or Alaska Native Asian (Cambodian and Vietnamese only) Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander
Citizenship or Immigration Status	Eligible candidates will need to provide proof of US citizenship or DACA* approval letter.
Educational Status	 Eligible candidates will be: 2nd year medical students for the 2022-2023 academic year Enrolled in MD or DO programs in accredited US medical schools

*DACA status must be valid through the end of the BMSF CIPP.



Application Tips

□ Proof of US Citizenship accepted:

- ✓ US birth certificate
- ✓ Current US passport
- ✓ USCIS Certificate of Naturalization
- ✓ Voter's registration card accompanied by photo ID
- ✓ *Deferred Action for Childhood Arrival (DACA) status accepted via DACA approval letter

☐ Current academic transcript is required

- ✓ Unofficial transcript is acceptable
- ✓ Transcript from previous academic year or most recent program is acceptable, if current version is incomplete

*DACA status must be valid through the end of the BMSF CIPP.

- □An Official Letter of Financial Aid Award Offer should be available from your current Office of Financial Aid
 - ✓ May be available via student portal. If not, may be requested from Financial Aid Officer

- ☐ Student Aid Report (SAR) from US Department of Education

- Focus Areas: Substance Use Disorders (SUDs)/Opioid Use Disorders (OUDs), Addiction Medicine, Behavioral Health Integration, Cultural Competence in HIV/AIDS Prevention, Treatment and Care, Health Equity and Social Determinants of Health
- Eligible Students: Medical Students (MD, MD/PhD, DO, DO/PhD), Graduate Nursing, and Graduate Physician Assistant Students

BMSF CIPP FAQs

I applied for the PCLP Externship. Am I allowed to participate in both?

No. The PCLP and BMSF CIPP Programs run concurrently. Applicants can apply for both; however, they cannot participate in both during the same academic year.

How are accepted Scholars matched with a program city?

Factors include applicant preference, local services (i.e., available housing, childcare, etc.), and availability during the program period.

What are my weekly hours for BMSF CIPP?

Most Site Partners operate on a business schedule (i.e., 9:00 AM - 5:00 PM on weekdays), but this may vary by site. Scholars will follow the schedule established by the placement site.

What is my day-to-day going to be like on site?

The daily schedule will vary by site. All Scholars will have exposures to clinical research activities, opportunities for community engagement, learning days, meetings with site leaders, and mentoring by an early-career physician.

May I miss a few days of the program?

No. BMSF CIPP spans only six-weeks, and Scholars may not miss time on site.

My Letter of Recommendation (LOR) writer needs extra time. Is that all right?

Yes. LOR writers may have up to two additional weeks to submit their materials via SurveyMonkey Apply. They can also send their letter to us directly at DCTCDPinfo@nmfonline.org.

When will accepted scholars be notified?

Accepted Scholars will be notified in March 2022.

Will I have to be vaccinated from COVID-19 to participate in BMSF CIPP?

Yes, each Scholar will need to provide proof of receiving the COVID-19 vaccination.
