The Robert A. Winn Clinical Investigator Pathway Program (Winn CIPP)

Mission

The Robert A. Winn Clinical Investigator Pathway Program is building the pathway of community-oriented clinical trialists of diverse backgrounds who are committed to increasing inclusion, equity and diversity in the conduct of clinical and translational research.





Key Program Elements

Commitment	Provide immersive community-based experiences in clinical trial research to 290 medical students from groups underrepresented in medicine.	
Program	6-week summer externship to learn the basics of clinical trials and effective community outreach, education, and engagement to increase diversity in clinical trials.	
Timeframe	Summer 2022-2026; Students must be available to be on-site for one of two full 6-week program periods.	
Award	\$7,500 Guidance for the award: The stipend is to cover travel, lodging, and living expenses during the externship.	
Externship Supervision	Winn CIPP Students will be hosted by community-based clinical research organizations , such as CTSA and NCORP sites, and community health centers engaged in clinical research. Host sites receive grants of \$3,600/student.	
2023 Locations* (est. 2 sites per city; 4 students per site)	Atlanta, GA • Chicago, IL • Los Angeles, CA • New Orleans, LA • Albuquerque, NM • New York, NY • Richmond, VA • San Antonio, TX	
Mentoring	Winn CDA Scholars will mentor Winn CIPP Students, sharing their clinical research experiences and knowledge of clinical research career pathways.

Winn CIPP Student Eligibility Criteria

Candidate Profile	 Eligible candidates will identify as underrepresented in medicine: African American or Black Hispanic or Latine American Indian or Alaska Native Southeast Asian Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander 	
Citizenship or Immigration Status	Eligible candidates must be a US citizen, US Permanent Resident, or have Deferred Action for Childhood Arrival (DACA) Approval.	
Educational Status	 al Status Eligible candidates will be: Current 1st - 3rd year Medical students Enrolled in MD, MD/PhD, DO or DO/PhD programs in accredited US medical schools for the 2022-2023 academic year 	

*DACA status must be valid through the end of the Winn CIPP

Step 5	Complete Applicant Information Form	Mostly the same as Eligibility Form
Step 6	Select Student Placement Preferences	Preference for program period and cities
Step 7	3 Personal Statements (300-500 words each)	 Experience with underserved populations Demonstration of cultural competence Commitment to increasing diversity in clinical trials
Step 8	Upload CV/Resume	Most recent CV or Resume
Step 9	Submit Application	Ensure all materials have been appropriately filled in and uploaded - then submit!

Winn CIPP FAQs

When will students be notified?

Early Decision applications will be notified in early-February 2023.

Regular Decision applicants will be notified in mid-March 2023. Applicants who are not accepted for Early Decision will automatically be considered for Regular Decision.

How are accepted Scholars matched with a program city?

Factors include applicant preference, local services (i.e., available housing, childcare, etc.), and availability during the program period. Please note the cities are subject to change. City and site matching may take place after the official award notice.

What are my weekly hours for Winn CIPP?

Most Site Partners operate on a business schedule (i.e., 9:00 AM - 5:00 PM on weekdays), but this may vary by site. Students will follow the schedule established by the placement site.

What is my day-to-day going to be like on site?

The daily schedule and experience will vary by site. All Scholars will have exposures to clinical research activities, opportunities for community engagement, learning days, meetings with site leaders, and mentoring by an early-career physician.

May I miss a few days of the program?

No. Winn CIPP spans only six-weeks, and students may not miss time on site. Rare exceptions can be made. For prior school-related obligations, students are required to have their time off approved by their site placement and Winn CIPP staff well in advance.

Will I have to be vaccinated from COVID-19 to participate in Winn CIPP?

Yes, each student will need to provide proof of receiving the COVID-19 vaccination and booster. Most sites will require additional health screenings and proof of full series immunizations in order for students to be present on-site.

What deliverables am I expected to submit at the end of Winn CIPP?

In addition to active participation in the program and its events, students will be required to submit the following deliverables:

- Paper
- Poster
- PPT Presentation at Culminating Event
- Weekly Progress Reports
- Program Surveys
- Time Sheets
