God's word to common situations



1. We are taken advantage of or attacked by an enemy

Matthew 5:43 But I say unto you, love you enemies, and pray for those who persecute you.

Matthew 5:39 But I say unto you, do not resist him who is evil; but whoever slaps you on your right cheek, turn to him the other also.

2. Giving to the poor or doing something good.

Matthew 6:3-4 But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing that your alms may be in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will repay you

3. Shortage of money, clothes and/or food. Job insecurity

Matthew 6:25-34 Do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear.... But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Therefore, do not worry about tomorrow,

Philippians 4:6-7,19 Be anxious for nothing. With thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God. And my God shall supply all your needs.

John 14:1: "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in me.

4. Conflict with spouse, family, co-workers, or neighbours.

Bible Survey

- The new testament, or agreement through faith in Christ,
- The old testament or covenant, which was the law of Moses.

New Testament

The New Testament contains 27 books written between approximately AD 45 and 95. The books fall into 5 categories

- 1. The 4 Gospels Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John which recount Jesus's birth, life, teachings, death, and resurrection
- 2. Acts an account of the early church after Jesus's ascension
- 3. Pauline Epistles letters written by Paul to provide teaching and encouragement to early Christians
- General Epistles – letters written by church leaders like James and Peter to provide teaching and encouragement to early Christians
- Revelation an apocalyptic vision of the end times received by the apostle John

The Gospels

Luke 1:1-4 Inasmuch as many have undertaken to compile a narrative of the things which have been accomplished among us, just as they were delivered to us by those who from the beginning were eyewitnesses and ministers of the word, it seemed good to me also, having followed all things closely, for some time past, to write an orderly account for you, most excellent Theophilus, that you may know the truth concerning the things of which you have been informed.

John 20:30-31 Many other signs therefore, Jesus also performed in the presence of His disciples, which are not written in this book, but these have been written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His name.

Acts

Acts 1:1 In my former book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus began to do and to teach 2 until the day he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen. 3 After his suffering, he presented himself to them and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God.

Bible Languages

The Old Testament was written primarily in Hebrew, a Semitic language that is written from right to left and has no vowels in the text. Some small portions of the Old Testament are in Aramaic,

The New Testament was written in a common vernacular form of Greek since this was the written language known by the largest number of people in the Near East in the first century. The New Testament also contains some Aramaic and Latin words.

Manuscripts



Old Testament - There are about 1700 Hebrews copies of all or parts of the Old Testament as well as 350 copies of it in a Greek translation (Septuagint), dating back to about 900 AD, or about 1300 years after the OT was completed.

New Testament - There are 4000 Greek, 8000 Latin, and 1000 other copies of all or parts of the New Testament, dating mostly to about 300 AD. Some fragments, however, go back to 120 AD, only 30 years after John wrote his Gospel.

Inspiration of God



2 Timothy 3:16

All scripture is inspired by God and is profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction and for training in righteousness.

First of all you must understand this, that no prophecy of scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation because no prophecy ever came by the impulse of man, but men moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.

 - The world is a sphere. Isaiah 40:21-22
 - The earth hangs on nothing. Job 26:7
- 4. Ability to change the lives of individuals as well as produce social reform
- 5. It has survived
- 6. Personal Testimony: personal experience of countless thousands of believers, the promises of God's Word have been fulfilled.

Guidelines for a Quiet Time



- 1. I write down what I would like to talk to the Lord in my Journal
- I quiet my heart and focus my eyes on the Lord and wait until I feel his presence and I see him
- 3. I thank the Lord for his time. I thank him for the things he has done for me the day before
- 4. I praise Him
- 5. I pray for the things that are on my heart and pray for others
- 6. I ask him what He would like to say to me today and journal what He says
- 7. I ask him for a Bible verse and read the verse he gives me
- 8. I often read a chapter of the bible that I have chosen.
- 9. I do a word study on any words I am not sure what they mean
- 10. I thank Him for his time.

Bible Study Method



Exposition, that is, expose or explain.

- 1. Observation: What does it say?
- 2. Interpretation: What does it mean?
- 3. Application: What does it mean to me?
- 4. Meditation: What would the Lord say to you about the verse?
- 5. Memorization: Hide the word of the Lord in your heart
- 6. Pray that your discoveries will have a positive impact on your life.
