JANUARY MEETING:


Date : Sunday, January 20, 1980

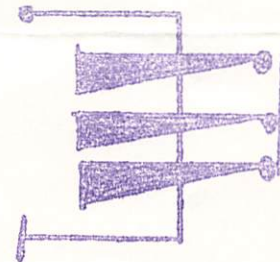
