
Chapter 94, in New Jersey is holding a Judges School on March 24-25. The instructor is Liza Weaver: 201-668-5107.

As of May 31st, Pease Approach is now closed from 11:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. Boston Center now handles that airspace when Pease Approach is closed.
