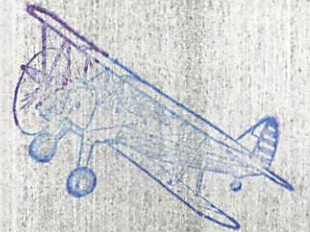
Chapter 94, in New Jersey is holding a Judges School on March 24-25. The instructor is Liza Weaver: 201-668-5107.

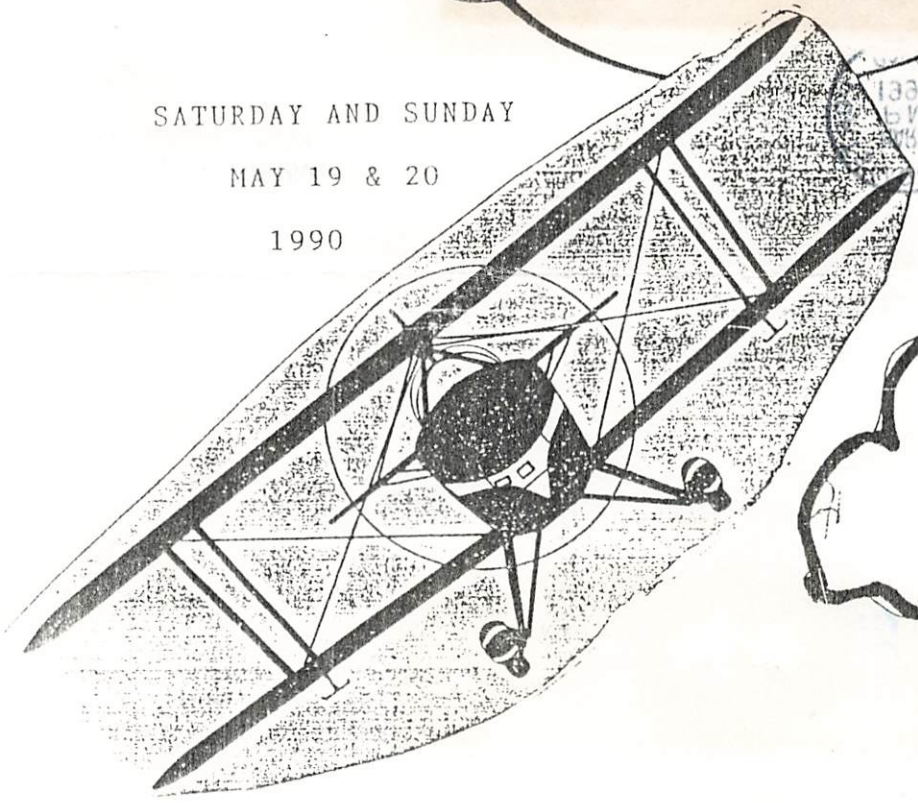

The airspace which Chapter 35 members are flying in has some major changes which all should be aware of.

Manchester Approach is scheduled to become an **ARSA**. The hearing for this ARSA is scheduled for July in New Bedford. The Manchester ARSA will have a major impact on aircraft flying in the Manchester area.

With the closing of Pease AFB, changes to the approach control at Pease are being made. As of May 31st, **Pease Approach is now closed from 11:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.** Boston Center now handles that airspace when Pease Approach is closed. This is in line with other approach control facilities in the area.

It appears the radar at Pease will remain when the Air Force vacates the facility, but details on exactly who will control what has not been decided.
