FLY FOR PATCHES







Strong Backpack, tan Excellent Condition Will repack before sale \$500 Call Craig Lesinski 508 695-0002 On June 18, fellow chapter member and my good friend, Jack Nolan, died in a take-off-and-departure accident at a private airfield near Utica, New York. Jack was flying a friend's Cessna home from a family gathering. Although the government's investigation is incomplete, observers reported seeing the airplane climb to a height of 100-200 feet and begin a turn. The nose dropped and the aircraft descended. Jack's Dad, Tom, also a pilot and aircraft homebuilder, witnessed the accident.

Jack and I lived in the same small New Hampshire town two miles from each other. While still in college, he traveled here to look over a small airfield he'd seen many times from the air. Jack was so smitten with the area and with the local flying community that he and Liz built a house across the street from the runway.

Although Jack and I knew many of the same people and went to the same hangar parties, we never became close until his affection for aerobatics surfaced and "The Moose," his Decathlon, arrived at Brookline last year. Jack immersed himself in aerobatics like a man possessed. One of the most endearing things about him was the intensity with which he treated those things in his life he cherished: his family and friends, his commitment to work and community, and, of course, aviation. Both the fire in his eyes and the wry, slightly mischievous smile forever on his face got brighter as he became engaged in the things that made his life so full.

Jack flew away with trophies from each of the two aerobatic contests he entered: Best First-Time Competitor at Orange, New York, last year, and First-Place Sportsman at our Chapter's Orange, Massachusetts, contest this May. Liz, Jack's wife, and Kevin, their fourteen-month-old son, came to our contest to watch and lend support for a couple of hours each day. He made two great flights. At a celebration dinner at their home a few days later, Liz recalled that Jack's real thrill came from her reaction when he phoned home to tell them about the victory. Liz said she "was so excited she was screaming and bouncing off the walls." Her pride in Jack made him the happiest man in the world.

On Saturday October 15, eight members of the New England Aerobatic Club put on a number of aerobatic demonstrations as part of an open house at the Chatham Municipal Airport. This was part of an event to raise money for a scholarship fund sponsored by the **Chatham Airport Pilots** Association (CAPA). It has been reported that almost \$2000 was raised for the fund. 


