#### SOCIAL SERVICES

SEA's social services are provided by licensed social workers who complete assessments, develop service plans, and provide assistance to stabilize the crisis situation. The social workers are knowledgeable of local resources and often collaborate with other agencies to better serve individuals and families in our community.



Food donations are received from churches, businesses, schools, and individuals.

During summer months, produce is provided by the local Farmers Markets, University of Montevallo Organic Garden, and individuals.

#### **EDUCATION SERVICES**

In 2012 there were 855 individuals that received services from the Education Department. One of the services provided is budget management. The client attends a budget session and information is given to help the individual meet expenses and become more self-sufficient. There were 170 budgeting sessions provided. during the year.

#### S.T.E.P. SERVICES

Shelby Teens for Effective Parenting, STEP, is available to pregnant or parenting teens (ages 12-19) who are residents of Shelby County. STEP meets on a weekly basis at Shelby County Schools and the classes are designed to directly impact the physical and emotional well being of teen parents. Lessons include prenatal and parenting topics.

#### THE GOAL

TO PROMOTE HEALTHY BABIES AND MOMS, EDUCATE PARENTING

STYLE CHOICES WHILE ENCOURAGING SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

#### In 2012:

- 69 teens participated in STEP
- 97% of the teens maintained school enrollment
- Of 28 births to teens, all were healthy babies with birth weights (5 lbs, 8 oz+)

#### SEA THRIFT STORE

The SEA Thrift Store provides assistance to our clients who are in need of clothing, household items, furniture and appliances. The Thrift Store is also available for local shoppers who enjoy finding collectibles and good bargains. Customers are always informed about the services provided by SEA and are pleased to learn that their purchases help people in need.



# SHOP SAVE GIVE

#### In 2012:

- SEA Thrift Store assisted 128 individuals with needed items
- 13 families were assisted who were homeless or victims of house fires.
- 65 children received clothing assistance.
- Items provided to clients was valued at \$2,174
- 51 volunteers worked and provided over 982 hours of service at the Thrift Store.
- More than 460 thrift store donations were received

#### HELPING US HELP PEOPLE

Since its beginning, Shelby Emergency Assistance has depended on volunteers to provide a variety of services.

#### In 2012:

- 106 Volunteers provided office/clerical services, assisted with the food pantry, worked in the thrift store, and provided direct assistance to clients
- Volunteers provided over 1,993 hours of service
