Dear Port St. Lucie Historical Society Members,

Have you driven by the historic homes recently? There has been a great transformation in recent months and even weeks, which is why I am providing you this update on what is happening at the Peacock Lodge aka the "Port St. Lucie History Museum and Education Center."

In early June, the City worked tirelessly to complete Pioneer Park and Playground which officially opened on June 15th. If you haven't stopped by yet, do so. The park is beautiful and there is nothing like it in our city or even the surrounding areas. Our City did a great job in creating this new venue for our residents and visitors to enjoy.

The Society participated in the opening events and also hosted a Classic Car Show! Everyone who visited us at our booth was very excited to hear about our future museum and we have had many new members join in recent weeks.

But the best part of all the exciting news....we have the key!!!. In late May the City's contractor obtained a "move in permit" which allowed the Port St. Lucie Historical Society to begin moving our many boxes and file cabinets of archives and memorabilia into the Peacock Lodge. We have begun to transform the interior into a workable place to display our exhibits and collectibles. We still have a long way to go, but I wanted to let you know, things are beginning to take shape. We have unpacked 40 plus years of collectibles and donated items, organized and arranged some of the furniture, and set up our computer system, among other things.

The City of Port St. Lucie has been working closely with us, as the



exterior is completed. Final landscaping went in just last week and gutters are being installed. We aren't ready to open yet, but we are nearing that day.

Last Thursday, (June 27th)
Mayor Shannon Martin, Councilmembers Picket, Bonna and Morgan and city staff visited the museum and presented the Society Board with a beautiful plaque which included a watercolor of the Peacock Lodge and ceremonial key which will be displayed on our wall in the museum to commemorate the City turn-



ing the building over to the Society. We are very grateful for the support we have received from our biggest supporter, the City of Port St. Lucie. We are thankful that after countless years, we will finally be fulfilling a dream of the Society to have a history museum for all to enjoy and learn about our beginnings and for us to "preserve our past for the future".

GIVE A BRICK ... IT WILL LAST FOREVER

As "The Port" takes shape on Westmoreland Boulevard, and the restoration of the historic homes began, the Port St. Lucie Historical Society took on a brick paver project to build a plaza between the two historic homes. The purpose of the project is to make the Society more financially sustainable, especially with the museum and education center opening sometime in 2023.
