From Police Chief Coonce

Many people seem to be unaware of our animal ordinances. Let me point out a few highlights.

- 1. You must register ALL animals with City Hall this includes dogs, chickens, fowl of all kinds, horses, mules etc. The only exception is cats they do not need to be registered. You are not allowed to have pigs in the village.
- 2. Dogs not only need to be registered but you must also get them licensed and issued a dog tag every year. The cost is only \$5 for spayed and neutered dogs and \$10 for unfixed.
- 3. You are not allowed to own more than five dogs and cats. You can own up to five dogs, or five cats, or a combination of the two, but the total must be five or less.
- 4. You are not allowed to let any dog run at large in the Village. If we catch your dog at large, we may impound it. There is a \$15 a day fee for impoundment.
- 5. Finally, we have a noise ordinance that prohibits you from allowing your dogs to bark for long periods of time outdoors.

Reduce, Reuse and Recycle

Waste is often an unavoidable result of human activity. It occurs in our homes, schools, offices and factories. How we choose to handle that waste affects the air, water and land and the humans, plants and animals that rely on them. It is important that we manage our waste responsibly.

There are four basic approaches to responsible waste management. The three R's - reduce, reuse and recycle - are three approaches, and the most environmentally preferred. Reducing, reusing and recycling waste helps save landfill space by keeping useful materials out. The amount of energy and natural resources needed to produce or collect the raw materials and manufacture the product are reduced. Greenhouse gas emissions caused by shipping the product to wherever it will be sold are reduced. Unfortunately, not all waste can be reduced, reused or recycled, which brings us to the fourth approach - proper disposal. Through processing, if necessary, and proper disposal, we can prevent harmful contamination from those waste materials. From Claycomo Code of Ordinances

ARTICLE III, Division 1, Sec. 21-37 Fireworks

(i) Discharge prohibited at certain times and in certain places.

(1) It shall be unlawful for any person to discharge or shoot any type of fireworks at any time within the village except permitted consumer fireworks may be discharged:

- a. Between 10:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. *July* third (3rd) annually; and
- b. Between 10:00 a.m. and 12:00 Midnight on *July* fourth (4th); unless any of said days fall on a Sunday, in which case permitted consumer fire works may not be discharged before noon that day.
