From Police Chief Coonce

We have a stray cat problem in the Village. These are wild animals and should be treated as such. PLEASE do not feed stray cats. If you do, they will stay in your area and multiply. Our ordinance allows citizens of Claycomo to legally have (5) pets who are current on vaccinations and licensed through City Hall. By feeding these stray cats, you are assuming responsibility or ownership for them. This is a violation of ordinance:

Sec. 7-34. - Limitation of number of dogs and cats.

(a) It shall be unlawful and a public nuisance for any person in charge of a residence to keep or allow to be kept five (5) dogs or five (5) cats, or any combination of such animals exceeding five (5) over the age of one hundred twenty (120) days at such residence unless the residence is licensed as a commercial animal establishment. (b) When animals more than the limit established by this section are found at a residence, all the dogs and/or cats found at the residence may be removed to an appropriate animal shelter, except if the person in charge of the residence, if present, may designate and retain up to five (5) dogs and/or cats.

(Ord. No. 2164, § 1, 2-10-1992; Ord. No. 3031, 6-14-2021)

If you have a stray cat problem on your street, please let us know and we will do our best to ensure no one is feeding and encouraging the animals to stay in the area.

We have a standing agreement with Northland Animal Welfare Society (NAWS) that any cat captured and brought to them will be spayed or neutered at the expense of the Village of Claycomo.
