


Registered Teacher Apprenticeship Program (RTAP)



Emergency Credentials and Clinical Practice





Clinical Practice

Candidates going through an EPP in Tennessee must complete both "Clinical Experiences" and "Clinical Practice."

- <u>Clinical Experience</u> is defined as "guided, hands-on, practical applications and demonstrations of professional knowledge... through collaborative and facilitated learning... across a variety of settings."
- <u>Clinical Practice</u> is defined as "student teaching, internship, or jobembedded opportunities that provide candidates with sustained school-based responsibilities."



Clinical Practice

There are three types of clinical practice:

- <u>Student Teaching</u>: at least 15 weeks of full-time student teaching during one semester
- Internship: at least 100 days of direct teaching experience during one full school year
- Job-Embedded: at least 100 days of direct teaching experience during one full school year and the candidate must have a valid TN teaching license prior to beginning the clinical practice



Clinical Practice and Emergency Credentials

Academic and/or occupational permits are not permissible for any type of clinical practice.

However, student teaching and internship candidates CAN utilize the clinical practice permit in qualified endorsement areas regardless of whether they hold a bachelor's degree.

Job embedded educators MUST be on a practitioner license.

Rule and Policy Updates







Rule and Policy Updates

The following items were approved on **final read** during the August 16 State Board of Education (SBE) Meeting and are now operational.

- Educators can add the Dance endorsement if:
 - They have at least one course at the postsecondary level in dance, or
 - Are recommended by an EPP with a State Board-approved dance program.

The following items were approved on **first read** during the August 16 SBE Meeting. They must be approved on final read *prior* to implementation:

 Identifies the National Evaluation Series (NES) 815 Educational Leadership as an option for reactivation of an Instructional Leader License.



Postsecondary Degree Accreditation

Please note: The updates on this slide were approved on **first read** during the **August 16** SBE Meeting. The rule changes must go through **final read** and **promulgation with the TN Secretary of State** prior to implementation. **Effective Date is TBD.**

Degree requirements for license issuance are being updated to include institutions with **regional or national accrediting organizations** recognized by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA) or the United States Department of Education (USDOE).

TDOE will be using this list of <u>CHEA- and USDE-Recognized Accrediting</u> <u>Organizations</u> to identify appropriate accrediting agencies.

Previous assessments will be accepted through 2027.



Reminders

- Professional license validity periods have been extended to 10 years.
 - All educators that currently hold a professional license have had 4 years automatically added to their license validity period.
- Coursework completion requirement has been removed for candidates enrolled in a job-embedded School Counselor program.
 - -EPPs no longer need to submit a letter confirming coursework completion with jobembedded school counselor applications.
- New split endorsements for ESL, PE, and Health and Wellness:
 - DO NOT replace the K-12 endorsements
 - -Are ONLY issued to Out of State Licenses
 - At this current time, TDOE is NOT planning to approve in-state SAPs for the split endorsements.




Summer Licensure Processing

Transactions Processed








Initial Licensure Transactions

Vacancy Data Comparison



Math HQIM EPP Landscape Survey

- Chapter 551 of the Public Acts of 2024 charged the department of education with conducting a landscape analysis of math instruction in Tennessee. Part of this statutory charge included collecting and reporting on "the practices used by educator preparation providers in this state to prepare mathematics teachers for educator licensure."
- The department will send the questions in advance.
- We recommend you encourage relevant faculty to respond.
- Deadline to respond is October 16, 2024.
