ENGLISH HAWK

John Edward Hawkins was born 06 January 1633 in Dartmouth, England. He married Dorothy Slade 20 July 1654 in Saint Andrew, Plymouth, Devon, England. He died in 1675 in York, Virginia, British Colonial America. Dorothy Slade was born in 1635 in Plymouth St. Andrew, Plymouth, Devon, England to William Slade and Jane Carlyon. She married Edward Hawkins 20 July 1654. She died in 1668.

AMERICAN HAWK

Edward Hawkins was. born 15 December 1660 in Bristol Parish, Charles City County, Virginia, British Colonial America. By 1706, Edward Hawkins moved from York County to New Kent County. Then he and Elinor moved to Dinwiddie sometime before 1720. He purchased land for thirty schillings on the south side of Stoney Creek in Prince George County. Today that area is still designated "Hawkins Run of Stony Creek." Edward Hawkins was born 15 December 1660 in Bristol Parish, Charles City County, Virginia and died February 1717 in York, Virginia. Eleanor Tinker was born 23 February 1661 in Laurel, Henrico, Virginia, British Colonial America to John Tinker and Anne Taylour. She married Edward Hawkins 15 June 1680 in Bristol Parish, Charles City County, Virginia, British Colonial America. She died in 1720 in Laurel, Kentucky.

Edward and Elinor had seven children: Robert V Hawkins was born 1680 and died in 1754 in York County, Virginia; Aimie Hawkins was born 08 June 1682 and died in 1725 in York County, Virginia; Edward Hawkins Jr. was born in 1684 in York County, Virginia and died in 1782 in Virginia; Michael Micah Hawkins Sr. was born in 1685 and died in 1752; Solomon Hawkins was born in 1681; William Hawkins was born in 1682 and died 1786; Richard Hawkins was born in 1696.

REVOLUTIONARY HAWK

Edward Hawkins was born in 1743 in Lunenburg, Virginia to John Hawkins and Ruth Harbored. He married Winifred Wells in 1777 in South Carolina. He (Edward Hawkins) is acknowledged as a Revolutionary Patriot for his service as a Private March 1783 - November, 1783 (military date 25 April 1783). Winifred Wells was born in 1756 in Dinwiddie, Virginia to David Wells and Susanna Traylor. David Wells served in the American Revolutionary War as a "Patriot." In 1783 he applied tax to the payment for goods (SAR Patriot # P-337054). She married Edward Hawkins in 1777 in South Carolina. She died in 1799 in Anderson County, South Carolina.

Edward and Winifred had five children: Daniel Edward Hawkins born in 1774 in Virginia; Amelia Hawkins born 1778; Fanny Hawkins born 1781; Williamson Hawkins born August 1790 in Greenville, South Carolina and died 04 August 1875 in Birmingham, Jefferson, Alabama; James Hawkins born 1792.

LOTTERY HAWK

Edward Hawkins was born 1774 in Dinwiddle County, Virginia. He was a fortunate drawer in the Land Lottery of the Cherokee country, in the 14th District Section in Georgia (374th Putnam). He died in Brunswick County, Virginia in 1850. Edward married Susanna Taylor. She was born in 1776 in Virginia to B and Eliza Taylor registered as "Colored." She married Daniel Edward Hawkins in 1794. She died 23 March 1875 in Brunswick, Virginia.

Edward and Susanna had five children: Nathaniel born 1807 and died 1886; Solomon born 1800; Uriah born 1814 in Hall, Georgia; Dennis born 10 August 1794 in Georgia and died 18 May 1884 in Blount County, Alabama; Edward born 1800 in Georgia.

ALABAMA HAWK

Nathaniel Hawkins was born in 1807 in Hall, Georgia. He married first Charlotte Cox 23 September 1827 in Fayette County, Georgia. Charlotte, born to John and Sara Cox July 1807, died in 1858, and he married Margaret Dellia Murry 13 May 1875 in Trout Creek St. Clair County, Alabama. Margaret Dellia Murry was born in 1838/1841 in Montgomery, Alabama. Her parents were born in South and North Carolina. After Nathaniel Hawkins' death, she resided with her son, J. H. Hawkins near Lutie. She died 28 December 1920 and is buried in Lutie Cemetery. He bought property in Townships 14 and 15, St. Clair, Alabama

15 November 1853. In 1860, his land holdings were worth \$100 and his personal estate was estimated at \$400. He had at least 14 children. He died 07 March 1886 in St. Clair, Alabama when he fell dead at his stable door while feeding his stock.

Nathaniel and Charlotte had eleven children: Joseph Sykes born 25 December 1829 in Atlanta, Georgia and died 28 May 1886 in Marion County, Arkansas; Cynthia "Syntha" C born 1832 in Georgia and married first to Henry David Singleton and second William Day; Permelia A born 1833 and married to her brother-in-law William Day in Campbell, Georgia; Sarah Adeline born 1836; Edward David born 27 April 1839 in Fayetteville County, Georgia and died 20 October 1918 in Benton County, Arkansas and buried in Riverside Cemetery; Joh born 1841 in Georgia; Nancy E born 1844 in Georgia; Mary born 1843 in Georgia; Lucinda born 1846; Dicy Ann born 1849; Daniel born 1850 in Georgia. Nathaniel and his second wife, Margaret, had two children Jephtha H; William Henry A, miner by trade, born 05 September 1876 in Alabama, married Raney and died 02 December 1948.

ARKANSAS HAWK

Edward David Hawkins was born 27 April 1839 in Georgia (442-01-1527). He married Missouri C Brice 05 September 1861. She died of pneumonia, so he married Emily Bowles in 1873 in Madison County, Arkansas. Edward David Hawkins was a confederate soldier in the Fifty-First Partisan Rangers. In Civil War Prisoner of War Records, Edward is listed as a prisoner of war released 12 December 1863. A drought in Arkansas meant that in 1943 Ed and the Thornsberrys had to drill new wells on their farms. He died at his son's home six miles northeast of Springdale on Hickory Creek and was taken by wagon to Riverside Cemetery in Benton County, Arkansas 20 October 1918.

Edward David Hawkins married Missouri C Buice 05 September 1861 in Saint Clair, Alabama. She was born in 1843 in Georgia. They had a son, William Edward Augustus "Billy" Hawkins born 04 July 1862 in Montgomery, Alabama and a daughter Louiza. When William Edward Augustus was four years old and Louiza was two, the family started to Arkansas. On the way, Missouri Hawkins became ill and died 05 August 1861 in Georgia. Not being near a town, a coffin was made from a wagon box. After the burial, they resumed their trip to Arkansas. Edward remarried to Emily Bowles. She was born 19 January 1857 in Travellers Rest, Owsley County, Kentucky to James Daniel Bowles and Lydia Williams. She had a brother, William Bowles. Emily Bowles died 12 March 1882 as a result of childbirth only hours after the birth of their fifth child who she named after her father, James Daniel Bowles. She belonged to the Happy Hour Euchre Club.

Edward and Missouri had two children: a daughter and William "Uncle Billy" Edward Augustus. William was born in 04 July 1862 in St. Clair County, Alabama and died in 09 May

1940 from "sober pneumonia." He first married Anne Wood and had one child, Dora. Upon Mrs. Hawkins' death, William married Rachel Witt 25 December 1889. They had eight children. William was in farm and timber work. He died 09 May 1940 in St. Paul, Arkansas and is buried Riverside Cemetery.

Edward and Martha Ellen had five children. Martha Ellen Hawkins was born on 01 March 1874 in St. Paul, Arkansas. She died in California. Henry Harvey Hawkins was born 30 August 1875 in Arkansas in Saint Paul, Madison County, Arkansas. He died 10 July 1933 in Madison County, Arkansas and is buried in Riverside Cemetery. He married Cordelia Presley and had a daughter Mae Hazel Hawkins. He was described as medium height and build with dark brown hair and blue eyes. He was a farmer. Lydia Alice Hawkins was born 14 January 1878 in Saint Paul, Madison County, Arkansas. She married John Freeman Wood (the day after her 15th birthday on 15 January 1893 in Madison, Arkansas. She died 24 September 1908 and is buried in Bidville, Crawford County, Arkansas. Their children were William Oliver, Bertha Emilie, Richard Myrtle, James Samuel, Bert, and Virgil Madison.

Elizabeth Hawkins was born 11 March 1880 in Arkansas and died 01 August 1949 in the Walden-Page Memorial Hospital in Wagoner, Oklahoma. She married William Jones. She is buried in IOOF Cemetery in Hulbert, Oklahoma. They had the following children, May McGowan, J.H. Jones, Alva Jones, and Edd Jones. James Daniel Hawkins was born 12 March 1882 in Crawford County, Arkansas and died 31 August 1967 of a cerebral vascular accident in Huntsville, Arkansas.

THORN HAWK

Martha Ellen Hawkins was born 01 March 1874 in St. Paul, Madison County, Arkansas. She died 23 September 1959 in Olivehurst, California and is buried in Sierra View Cemetery in Yuba County, California.

Edward Thornsberry married Martha Ellen Hawkins 02 February 1896 in Madison County, Arkansas. He was described as medium height, medium build with blue eyes and brown hair. He died 24 September 1958 and is buried in Sierra View Cemetery, Yuba County, California. We share this ancestor with the Canadian rock n roll singer Ronnie (Ronald) Hawkins of the band The Hawk. Martha Ellen Hawkins was born 01 March 1874 in St. Paul, Madison County, Arkansas. She died 23 September 1959 in Olivehurst, California and is buried in Sierra View Cemetery in Yuba County, California.
