Greater Philadelphia Real Estate Hall of Fame Announces 2026 Inductees

Four Industry Legends Join an Exclusive Honor Reserved for the Region’s Most Influential Leaders

Philadelphia, Pa. — February 18, 2026 — The Greater Philadelphia Real Estate Hall of Fame announced the four inductees who will comprise its 2026 class — an honor reserved for industry legends whose distinguished careers span decades and whose work has left a lasting imprint on the region.

The 2026 inductees are: Willard G. “Bill” Rouse III, founder of Rouse & Associates and Liberty Property Trust, honored posthumously; Marc B. Kaplin, founding principal of Kaplin Stewart; Lehigh Valley Industrial Park (LVIP); and Gerard H. “Jerry” Sweeney, President and CEO of Brandywine Realty Trust.

Established to recognize exceptional achievement in commercial real estate, the Greater Philadelphia Real Estate Hall of Fame honors those whose careers reflect both professional excellence and a deep commitment to community. The 2026 inductees will be formally recognized at an induction ceremony on October 22, 2026.

“This Hall of Fame was created to recognize the rare leader whose influence defines an era,” said **Trish Michell, Director Business Development LF Driscoll** “Each of these inductees earned this honor over decades of leadership, vision, and commitment to the region. Their collective impact on Philadelphia, the Lehigh Valley, and South Jersey is extraordinary.”

2026 Inductees

Willard G. Rouse III, (Posthumous Honor)

Reimagining cities through visionary development

Willard G. “Bill” Rouse was a pioneering developer whose work reshaped Philadelphia’s skyline and helped redefine modern mixed-use redevelopment. A leader in large-scale urban projects, Rouse played an instrumental role in revitalizing Center City by integrating office, retail, hospitality, and civic space into a single building, notably breaking the “gentlemen’s agreement” height limit to build One and Two Liberty Place. His work restored confidence in downtown investment at pivotal moments in the city’s history and his approach to public-private partnership and placemaking influenced not only Philadelphia’s skyline, but urban development strategies nationwide. Rouse also left an indelible mark on Philadelphia’s suburbs, developing the Great Valley Corporate Center and industrial buildings throughout South Jersey. A dedicated civic leader, Rouse spearheaded the development of the Pennsylvania Convention Center and the Kimmel Center for Performing Arts, among other notable projects. He died in May 2003 at the age of 60.

Marc B. Kaplin, Kaplin Stewart

The legal architect behind the region’s defining deals

Marc B. Kaplin is one of Greater Philadelphia’s most accomplished real estate attorneys, serving as trusted counsel on many of the region’s most significant transactions. Lehigh Valley Industrial Park (LVIP)

Building the Lehigh Valley’s industrial legacy

Lehigh Valley Industrial Park is one of the most influential industrial real estate owners and developers in the Northeast, playing a defining role in transforming the Lehigh Valley into a nationally recognized logistics, distribution, and manufacturing hub. As a nonprofit economic development corporation established in 1959, LVIP has spent decades making disciplined investments with generational impact, significantly stimulating economic activity across the region. LVIP has developed industrial space essential to global supply chains, driving massive job creation and long-term economic growth while cementing the Lehigh Valley's position as a critical engine of regional and national commerce. Since its inception, LVIP has developed seven industrial parks totaling millions of square feet that have attracted more than 500 companies and 25,000 jobs, generating private investment exceeding \$2.5 billion in support of its mission to create jobs, expand the regional tax base, and diversify the local economy. For the past 21 years, LVIP has concentrated on the redevelopment of 1,000 acres of the former Bethlehem Steel plant in South Bethlehem, a project that alone has attracted 38 companies, 4,600 jobs, and \$1.25 billion in private investment.

Gerard H. Sweeney, President and CEO, Brandywine Realty Trust
Steady leadership shaping the region’s growth

Gerard H. “Jerry” Sweeney is a highly respected commercial real estate leader whose career helped shape institutional investment, development strategy, and advisory services across Greater Philadelphia. As President and CEO of Brandywine Realty Trust, Sweeney has guided complex transactions and long-term portfolio strategies that strengthened key growth corridors, including the transformative Schuylkill Yards and Cira Centre developments in University City, Philadelphia’s Central Business District and highly desirable suburban markets such as Radnor. Beyond his development impact, Sweeney is widely recognized for his tireless civic work with a range of organizations including Schuylkill River Development Corp. Center City District Foundation, the Philadelphia Regional Port Authority and now leads the Market East Advisory Group, a group of 62 business and civic leaders responsible for revitalizing one of Philadelphia’s key commercial corridors. He serves on the boards of several other Philadelphia-based organizations and has mentored generations of real estate leaders.
