CITY FREE BRANCH PICK-UP FALL 2020: HYDE PARK NOVEMBER 9, 2020

The City of Springfield's residential 2020 **fall branch pick-up** begins Monday, October 26. The fall pick-up schedule is pre-set and crews will work in specified areas of the city each week. **Each neighborhood will have only ONE pick-up**.

HYDE PARK is in the Southeast area – on **November 9**, branches must be set out by 7:00 a.m. in the morning.

Branch piles are to be **placed in front of your own property**. Piles are to be no bigger than 3 feet high, 10 feet long and 4 feet wide. **Do not put** branch piles along North Cotton Hill. It is unsightly and against city code. The cul-de-sac at the south end of Sarah is where we put the branches from the common ground. Please do not put branches from your property there. Remember, you can cut up smaller branches (less than 2 inches in diameter) and put them in yard waste bags for free pick-up. **NO STICKERS REQUIRED.** This is a different program than the Branch Pick-up. We are in the South Zone and our FREE YARD WASTE BAG pick-ups are the weeks of October 5th and 19th, November 2nd, 16th and 30th, and December 14th and 28th.

DRAINAGE DITCHES AND SEWER GRATES

The Board would like to thank whoever cleaned up the weeds around the ditch drain between Sarah and the farm field. Thank you for also getting the erosion rock back in place. It looks great back there.

The leaves are starting to fall. This means the drainage ditches and street sewer grates are getting filled up. If you notice a clogged grate by your home, please take a minute to clean it out. When raking leaves from your yards, please rake them out of the gutter as well.

In a few weeks, after all the leaves have fallen, all the drainage ditches will need to be raked out to avoid flooding. Areas that will need attention: ditches along North Cotton Hill, ditch between Sarah and the farm field, concrete ditches at the Sarah cul-de-sac and ditches between Sarah and Anna and between Sarah and Delano. We need volunteers to do this work. Clean-up days will be announced soon.

TRICK-OR-TREAT

The City of Springfield strongly encouraged that anyone who would like to distribute treats should leave individually wrapped candy on a table on their front walkways, sidewalks, or any outdoor space that allows for at at least six-feet of social distance from the door.
