If we all work together, it will be a small task for everyone and provide great enjoyment for all.

We are looking to hire lifeguards who are interested in working at the Hyde Park pool this summer. If you are interested in applying or know someone who is, please visit the Hyde Park website for an application. If you have any questions, please contact Cindy Chalkley.

We are hoping to provide the opportunity for homeowners to be able to schedule a pool party this summer, pending IDPH guidelines permitting the return to our regular number of allowed swimmers in the pool area. We will let you know as soon as we know. An approved babysitter will be allowed to take your children to the pool. Please fill out the form on the Hyde Park website.

Swimming lessons will be provided for homeowners and their children age 4 and over. If you or your child are interested in taking swimming lessons, please visit the Hyde Park website and complete the Swimming Lessons form. We also would like to provide you the opportunity for younger children to take swimming lessons from a qualified instructor (there would be a cost). ### **REMINDERS: DOGS, TREES, BRANCHES & LOCKS**

Please be sure that your dog is on a leash and under control when walking in the common areas. Springfield does have a leash law and it applies to Hyde Park as well. Dogs are not allowed in the pickleball/tennis court area. Also, please be sure to have bags with you to pick up after your dog. Did you know that dog poop is not biodegradable? It will decompose slowly, but it contains bacteria and viruses that are not good for our water system. And it certainly is not pleasant to step in!

We are truly blessed to have so many amenities for our children's play (e.g., the playground, the basketball court, the pickle ball and tennis courts, the pool.) **The common area trees are not one of the amenities that our children should play on.** Several children have been seen climbing very high up into some of the trees. This is dangerous. Tell your children not to climb the trees or to hang onto the low branches of the pines.

The City's first free branch pick up this year is on May 17th. Do not put branches along North Cotton Hill or in the ditches. Do not put branches from your property in the cul-de-sac at the far end of Sarah. Do not drag branches across North Cotton Hill to the Deerwood Lake ditches. The neighborly thing to do is to place branches from your property in front of your own property. See the enclosed flyer for more information about this year's schedule.

Please lock the picklball/tennis court gates when you leave.
