- Wildlife- Biodiversity, Loss of Habitat, Human-Wildlife Conflict
- Farmed and Working Animal Welfare, Animal Transport and Related Issues
- Environmental Degradation Deforestation, Uncontrolled Natural Resource Usage, Air and Water Pollution, Waste Management
- Climate-Related Impacts, Melting Glaciers, Water Resources, and Natural Disasters (GLOFs).






An Idea for a Kick-Off Event for SAVE-Nepal


