Message from Pastor Allen


Jackie, we wish you well! We miss you but we expect to see you again sometime soon! We love you, Jackie!

We live in a "label conscious" society where so many people seem preoccupied and sometimes obsessed with labels—brand and social labels. Advertising firms bombard us with brand label hype to influence our self-image and how we spend our money and the news media bombards us with social label hype to influence what we value and how we think. This points to a flaw in our society: Secular Conformity—people want to look, act, and

live according to what's popular. In a recent sermon, Pastor Allen spoke to us about *Secular Humanism*—people believe they are capable of morality and self-fulfillment without the belief in God. As a result of these flaws, people end up feeling disappointed, empty, and angry. This is evidenced by the rapid decay and decline we are witnessing today in our society. Pastor Allen explained, "Our human nature is flawed. Sin took away our connection to God. The love of God flows through us and not from us." So, when we distance ourselves from God, sin prevails and our spiritual life dims.

We are one in the body of Christ and it's through that unity that we are empowered to actively participate in our church's mission. Our moto, "Where Friends Become Family", can only be validated with unity of spirit, heart and service. We are called to a joint commitment to discipleship and stewardship by God who requires unity within His church. Pastor Allen reminded us, "God ordained value in us. Faith is a gift of trust; the gift of eternal life is given through grace."

In God's eyes, we are one, but the evil one tries to divide the House of God with lies and hype, so we must guard ourselves against the traps of secular conformity and humanism that disrupt unity. As each of us ventures out into the mission field, let's exchange those popular "social labels" with words of faith and service such as evangelist, witness, good Samaritan, and volunteer. As our journey takes us into this Advent Season, let's strive to get closer to God and be mindful that we are one body. Our diversity makes us rich but unity makes us strong. We serve the designer of mankind—the one true God. Brand and social labels do not define us. We only wear one label on our hearts—*Godmade*!


