
Will you follow the Lion who leads with strength? Will you trust the Lamb who laid down His life for you?














ODYSSEA: A SPIRITUAL JOURNEY

A Call for Renewal

"But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint." (Isaiah 40:31 NIV)

We are in the beginning of the Lenten Season [March 5—April 19] a time when spiritual disciplines are emphasized, such as prayer, mercy, and grace. Lent is a season when we set out on our personal search to enrich our faith and find a pattern of faithful living and expression on our journey of faith.

I have always had an affinity for Celtic music, carols, and culture. I have also been intrigued by the spirituality of the Celts—those people of faith from Ireland and the British Isles who have a tradition of sanctity, learning, and stewardship. In their tradition, there is a sense of unity and balance in life that the "Celtic Knot" symbolizes. "Celtic knotwork patterns are symbols of our life's journey, an attempt to make sense of the maze of our existence. They represent a continuity of life with no beginning and no end, a journey to one's spiritual center, an inner quest for spiritual rebirth, and a pathway to the sacred and divine source of life." From the ancient source of the Christian experience, we find insight into the importance of recognizing that all aspects of our life and the life of all creation are entwined. The Lenten Season calls for renewal and gives us a sense of faithful responsibility in our actions and our witness to Jesus Christ.

Let's make this season of Lent a time of renewal—a time to realize that our personal and spiritual lives are entwined and to recognize our responsibility as individuals and as a community of faith in the world God has given us. One of the important concepts of the Celtic Christian faith is *anam cara* (soul friend): the philosophy and belief that two souls that experience this unique "soul friend" connection will be stronger together than they are apart. *Anam cara* describes a person who acts as a teacher, companion, and spiritual guide. Pastor Allen Miller is our church's *anam cara* because the role of a pastor is to be a "soul friend" to those they have been called to serve. The friendship between Christians is an act of grace, recognition, and belonging that fosters a deep and special companionship on our journey of faith.

Lord God Almighty, shaper and ruler of all creatures, we pray for your great mercy, that you guide us towards you, for we cannot find our way. And guide us to your will, to the need of our soul, for we cannot do it ourselves. And make our mind steadfast in your will and aware of our soul's need. Strengthen us against the temptations of the devil, and remove from us all the lust and every unrighteousness, and shield us against our foes, seen and unseen. Teach us to do your will, that we may inwardly love you before all things with pure mind. For you are our maker and our redeemer, our help, our comfort, our trust, our hope; praise and glory be to you now and forever. Amen.

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

Our church's Annual Congregational Meeting was held on Sunday, February 9, after a combined worship service and followed by a luncheon. The purpose of the meeting is to review the major church operations of the previous year. Pastor Allen, Ted Brown, and Kayla McDonald provided reports for their areas of responsibility. Pastor Ed was not able to attend, so Pastor Allen read Pastor Ed's report.

◆ Allen Miller, Senior Pastor

In my report given at the congregational meeting I shared a few highlights from 2024. The most important was the wonderful addition of Pastor Ed to our staff and the reorganization of the responsibilities for the Elders. Through Chairman Ted Brown's valuable input, our church is in a position of growth with stronger leadership. Each elder now has an area of ministry to oversee allowing the pastors more time to do our work of preaching and teaching.

Because of this restructuring we are able to expand our ministry and better meet the needs of those God is sending us. We are going to develop a 5-year plan for growth and future leadership. Pray with us for visitors to become members and for each member to become a disciple maker, fulfilling the Great Commission, Matthew 28:18-20.

◆ Ed Vidzicki, Associate Pastor

To briefly encapsulate my report into one paragraph, I would say that we are growing and along with growth comes challenges, responsibilities, and much needed prayer. Please prayerfully consider what God is asking you to do, and where you can use your gifts most appropriately. As a family of believers, let's charge forward as God calls each and every one of us to do.

◆ Ted Brown, Church Board Chair

We installed handicap bar in men's bathroom. Replaced mail boxes and wooden supports. Repaired the crack in brick flower box at the end of the church. Filled in ruts in front yard. Handicap opener installed at ramp door. Replaced stove thermostat. Replaced loose receptacles in Sanctuary. Deep cleaning in the kitchen, including replacing the wheels on the stove. Double door fridge repaired at no charge. Weed Wacker and accessories donated for grounds. Installed wall in Youth Center for B&G club storage. Painted step by ramp yellow. Painted vents for crawl space. Obtained materials to hook up new coffee maker. Repaired leak above ceiling in hall to restrooms and replace the ceiling tile. New carpet runners for doors at hall to Sanctuary. Preventative Maintenance items were checked for Safety items we can do in order to save service calls from venders. Monthly we conduct inspections of Fire Extinguishers, Emergency Lights, Exterior Doors. Quarterly: Smoke Detectors, Refrigerator Coil, HVAC Filters, Kitchen Hood Filter. Semi-Annually: Smoke Detector battery change, HVAC Coils. Also completed replaced 3 batteries for emergency lights. Volunteers would be helpful in completing these inspections, approximately one hour per month. More helpers would lessen the number of months for each one to cover. Thank you for your Building Fund donations.

◆ Kayla McDonald, Church Administrator & Assistant Treasurer

We ended last year with \$11,000 in our operating account, \$59 in our building fund, \$592 in our community missions account, and \$15,000 in our emergency savings. Our overall financial health is consistent with years past where unfortunately we are having to dip into our emergency savings to cover unexpected expenses and even building repairs. We are hoping that church membership will increase giving to the building fund in order to cover monthly maintenance and needed repairs. We thank all the faithful tithers in our church. What does leadership in the church look like and why is it important?

God has established offices for the oversight of His church. The Bible calls for pastors, elders and deacons.

Pastors, together with the elders are charged with the spiritual oversight and well-being of the church, no small task! The qualifications of the pastor/elder are given in Titus 1:5-9 as well as 1 Timothy 3:1-6. Both are called overseers, responsible for sound teaching and all aspects of church life.

This year the elders in our church have been following through on a much-needed review of these offices for the church. We have established specific areas of oversight for each elder to increase productivity and lighten the load of responsibility beyond the pastoral staff and administrator. In that respect, soon we will begin work on establishing Deacons and Deaconess who will be charged with the hands-on needs of the congregation as the early church did in Acts 6:1-6. This is part of a continuing effort to create an atmosphere of growth. We ask you to be in prayer for us to be faithful in following the Lord's leading in this work.

Here is the refined church leadership structure for the Community Church of Orchard and on the next page you will find the breakdown of elder responsibilities. These diagrams should help all those in the church, those new and seasoned attenders, understand who is responsible for certain duties and where to seek guidance if needed. 


