

### We Are Living Proof

When I was sixteen, I hosted a cookout for my church's youth group at my home. When I looked for the charcoal lighter fluid, I couldn't find it, so I grabbed the gas can from the garage. Then, when I attempted to light the charcoal using the gas can—suddenly flames shot up and ignited the can's nozzle. In my panic, I tossed the can away from me but instead of it going into the yard, it landed against the house right under the kitchen window. The impact against the ground caused the can to hop and spin so the fire went out.

Fortunately, nobody was injured and the fire didn't cause any damage to the house. Thank God! Oh, and Mom never knew it even happened...whew!

I met some friends for brunch at a small café in downtown Baltimore on a windy spring day in 1996. The outdoor tables had been removed due to the high wind gusts so we had to sit inside. Later, as we were leaving, I hesitated for just a few seconds before opening the door—suddenly we heard a loud crash outside! We peered out through the doorway and saw a wooden window lying on the sidewalk and shattered glass. We went outside, looked up, and saw that one of the building's windows three stories above had been blown off its bracket and sent plummeting to the ground below. Had we not hesitated and stepped through the door just a moment sooner or been sitting at an outside table when the window fell, we would have been seriously hurt. Nobody was in the area at the time when the window fell. Thank God!

One afternoon in 2010, I was driving some friends into Rehoboth Beach to have lunch at the Big Fish Grill. I looked to the left and saw the lane was clear so I started to pull out into the eastbound lane of Rt 404—suddenly my friend in the passenger seat yelled "watch out!" I looked ahead and saw an SUV coming towards us in the wrong lane at a great speed as it was passing another vehicle in the westbound lane. I reacted quickly and veered off onto the shoulder as the SUV zoomed by us with barely twelve inches of clearance between us. A serious accident had been avoided. Thank God!

Christians don't believe in coincidence, we believe in God and his presence. But often we can get wrapped-up in the ordinary everyday events that take place and we can take for granted the opportunities we have to experience the true presence of God. It is those extraordinary experiences—big splash events when potential danger is averted leaving us in awe—that should be celebrated because we know the hand of God was present in our midst. At that moment we are living proof that God is with us.

### SCRIPTURE-ENGAGED ADULTS HAVE LESS LONELINESS

The American Bible Society released the eighth chapter of its "State of the Bible USA 2024" report, focusing on "Loneliness." Americans with stronger spiritual lives and those who more commonly offer forgiveness experience less loneliness than those who are less engaged with the Bible or churches and those who don't commonly forgive others, a new survey suggests.

The research, based on 2,506 responses collected from American adults from Jan. 4-23, 2024, examined the relationship between a respondent's levels of religiosity and how frequently they experience loneliness. The data suggests that nearly three out of four Americans report moderate to high levels of loneliness, with over one-third of Generation Z women ages 18-27 experiencing high levels of loneliness.

"In our surveys, we've seen many ways that Americans benefit from Bible engagement, and we suspect that it might also help them feel less lonely. So, we're testing a hypothesis," the report reads. "If the nation is indeed experiencing an 'epidemic of loneliness,' what happens when people form a meaning-ful relationship with the God they meet in Scripture?"

The study adopted five questions from the UCLA Loneliness Scale, which asked people how frequently they experienced certain emotions. An answer of "1" was given if respondents "never" experienced an emotion and a "4" was given if they often experienced it. The maximum possible score on the UCLA Loneliness Scale is 20, while the minimum is 5.

Across three of the four generations examined, the "scripture engaged" had lower average loneliness scores than their counterparts in the "movable middle" and "Bible disengaged" categories. Only among the Baby Boomers and elder generations, encompassing those born in 1964 or earlier, did the "Bible disengaged" have a lower average loneliness score (10.5) than their "scripture engaged" counterparts (10.6). Among the oldest group of American adults, the "movable middle" had the highest average loneliness score (11.4). Looking at levels of loneliness based on church attendance, the data suggests those who "never" attend church had the highest incidence of high loneliness (25%), followed by those who had not been to church in at least a month but had gone within the past year (20%), those who last went to church over a year ago (16%), respondents who last went to church within the past month (15%) and those who attend weekly (12%).

The research also found a relationship between an individual's ability to forgive and their levels of loneliness. Thirty-six percent of those who identify as "strongly unable to forgive" experienced high loneliness, followed by 43% who reported moderate loneliness and 21% who reported low loneliness. Among those who consider themselves "somewhat unable to forgive," 22% reported high loneliness, 57% experienced moderate loneliness and 21% reported low loneliness.

Sixteen percent of those who characterize themselves as "somewhat able to forgive" reported high loneliness, along with 56% who experienced moderate loneliness and 28% who felt low loneliness. Those who consider themselves "strongly able to forgive" had the lowest share reporting high loneliness (16%) and the highest percentage experiencing low loneliness (35%) with the rest experiencing moderate loneliness.

"Some experts blame social media for fostering shallow connections that replace deep friendships. Our own research indicates that an inability to forgive could greatly increase levels of loneliness," American Bible Society's Chief Innovation Officer John Farquhar Plake said in a statement: "Regardless of the cause, the need is urgent. Churches should respond with care and creativity, offering a safe space to develop meaningful Christian relationships."

# **ANCIENT MOSAIC WITH BIBLE VERSE FOUND**

# Scientists find 1,500-year-old mosaic with Bible verse that 'blesses all who read it'.

Archaeologists have discovered a 1,500-year-old monastery near Israel with an intricate mosaic floor that features a Bible verse blessing all who read it. At the center of the intricately designed floor there is an inscribed verse in ancient Greek that reads: "Blessed are you when you come in and blessed are you when you go out." The discovery was made near the Israeli city of Kiryat Gat, the Israel Antiquities Authority (IAA) announced Monday.

The monastery dates back to the fifth through sixth centuries CE, which was during the rule of the Byzantine empire. Those years saw the spread of Christianity and the construction of significant religious sites such as the Church of the Holy Sepulcher in Jerusalem, DailyMail.com reported. "This is the largest and most significant Roman and Byzantine period site uncovered in this area," excavation leaders Shira Lifshitz and Maayan Margulis said. The mosaic floor also features crosses, lions, doves, an amphora (a ceramic maritime shipping jug), flowers and geometric patterns- a first-of-its-kind discovery.

"The mosaic discovered in Kiryat Gat is one of the most unique ever found in Israel," Mark Avrahami, head of artistic conservation at the IAA, said in the statement. It is so unique because of the incorporation of very small stones into its geometric pattern, which served to highlight the cross-shaped decorations, according to the researchers.

'Transferring mosaics is a complex process that requires great skill and precision," Avrahami said, but the floor will soon be moved to the IAA's mosaic workshop for preservation before being put on public display in the city of Kiryat Gat. The dig also uncovered remains of at least ten buildings, a wine-press and a large warehouse building. As well as a treasure trove of artifacts from the monastery and the surrounding site, including imported wares, coins, marble elements, and metal and glass vessels.

"The findings indicate a succession of settlement starting from the early Roman period (1st century CE) and through until the end of the Byzantine period (end of the 6th century CE)," the team said. The settlement is situated on a central road junction connecting the mountain region to the coastal plain and apparently served the area's smaller settlements as well as travelers passing by.







# THE STORY OF NOAH

The story of Noah includes a family, all the animals of the earth, a huge boat, a flood and why there are rainbows. Noah was 500 years old when his story began and he was the only one that was righteous (which means that he did things right) and he walked with God.

One day, God could see that all the people had become very bad, so bad that they stopped thinking of anything good. God was so sad and hurt that he wanted to get rid of every person and all the creatures that He had made. He wanted all the evil to stop.

The thing about God is that He gets very angry at our sin and all the bad stuff in the world, but we also know that God is love. **God is love**, so that means that He can be disappointed when we do bad things, but He still loves us, and that's why He remembered Noah.

God said to Noah, "I am going to put an end to all the people because the earth is full of evil. I am going to destroy them and the earth." God then gave Noah instructions on how to build the boat. He told him what kind of wood to use and how big to make it. He also told him to put a door on the side of the ark and to make it with three floors. The ark was humongous!

The Bible says that next God told Noah that He would make a covenant with him. A covenant is an agreement with a promise. God was going to flood the whole earth and everything else would die, but He would save Noah and his family—they would be safe in the ark. What's going into the Ark?
