A Message from Pastor Ed



A Season of Drought

"If you're walking through the valley and there are shadows all around you, do not fear, He will guide you; He will keep you safe and sound. He has promised to never leave of forsake you, and His Word is true." - God Is Good All The Time

In a recent sermon, Pastor Allen told us, "God uses our circumstances of life to change our way of looking at Him. There is at least a partial answer to the question when we ask God, 'Why do you let bad things happen?' My guess is that almost everybody here has asked God that question—Why?"

I had been concerned with my mom's condition so I convinced her to see a geriatric specialist. When the doctor asked her a few basic questions, I was astounded when she wasn't able to answer. Mom held a tight -lipped smile as the doctor told her she had advanced dementia and that he would have to revoke her driver's license and that it was no longer safe for her to live alone. At the age of 89, the independent lifestyle my mom had maintained for most of her life was over—*the time for difficult decisions had finally come*.

Two days later, I called Mom three times and she didn't answer, so I rushed to her home and found her laying on the kitchen floor—she called out to me but couldn't move her right side. Once hospitalized, the test results indicated she had a stroke the night before and was paralyzed as a result. I prayed and asked God, "Why?" After a week in the hospital and one month in rehab, she came to live with me. I promised Mom on her 80th birthday that she would never live in a nursing home—*I had to keep that promise*.

I started to empty Mom's house and midway through the process I began to have back pain. The pain persisted and my doctor felt that my symptoms were consistent with a pinched sciatica. My condition quickly worsened and the pain became so great that I could no longer work or function normally. My doctor referred me to a neurologist who ordered a full MRI which showed a tumor in my right hip. I asked God, "Why?" I went to Johns Hopkins and they ran tests with a harsh result—*I had a rare lymphoma cancer*.

My oncologist ordered a 6-cycle chemo treatment plan and my prognosis was good, but I was scared. I was so angry with God for allowing me to be ill at a time when my mom needed me. I was confined to bed and not able to spend time with Mom during much of the time when she was still coherent. I could hear her downstairs asking the nurse, "Where's my son?" After the 2nd treatment, I developed a neutropenic fever and spent a week at Johns Hopkins. I asked God in my prayers to change the situation and heal me so I could care for my mom. My fear was neutralized by the Grace of God—*God answered my prayers*.

After the 4th treatment, the pet scan showed I was cancer-free. I returned to work after a 6-month journey from being bed ridden, to wheelchair bound, to walking with a cane, and finally to being restored to good health. Mom lived for almost four years after the stroke to the age of 93 and I was able to maintain her homecare for the duration—*God made it possible for me to keep my promise.*

I'm sure many of you have experienced a season of drought at some point, but all our experiences are woven into our life's tapestry with the common threads of God's mercy, grace, and love that unifies us together in one fellowship—one community of faith.

• Oh God, whether we face the gloom of a storm or the despair of a drought, your everlasting arms reach out to us bringing comfort, courage, and caring. Empower us Lord to share our witness with those around us in gratitude and faithfulness. Amen.



CONTAGIOUS FAITH

This month's Contagious Faith spotlight is on Ruth Norbeck. I asked her to give us a bit of history.

◆ I was brought up Presbyterian and as a child my parents sent us kids to Sunday School, even though they only attended occasionally. I had great Sunday school teachers and mentors, and pastors along the way, most have all graduated; I sang in the kid's choir and later in the adult choir, I loved to sing the hymns as far back as I can remember, especially when I could go up in the balcony of the church where the choir loft was before they remodeled the church. Most girl were Girl Scouts, but I became a Sunbeam which was with the Salvation Army church in Darby, PA. Let me tell you a little story about my camping trip with



them: One of the girls got sick after we went to bed and our counselor had to take her to call home, so we were in our cabin alone, and some of the girls got very scared and started crying. I got up and told them not be afraid because I saw Jesus watching us from the window. I'm not sure if that scared them more but I felt safe, and I really saw His face. Looking back at that now I realize I was part of God's family back then.

I became a deacon and elder, as well as clerk of session at Tully Memorial Church. I taught Sunday school and helped with the VBS programs, and it was there that I found a passion to work more with kids. I wasn't one of the cool kids in school, I just didn't fit in, and in fact looking back I would have considered myself bullied. When things got me down or upset, I'd ask myself what would Jesus do? I even believed I had the power to help people in Jesus' name, with my touch because I had Jesus living inside me.

I feel I found my faith in God as a child going to Sunday School and being a Sunbeam. Did I struggle? Yes. Did I do things trying to fit in? Yes. Did I go against the Ten Commandments with mind or deeds? Yes. Does God still love me? Yes. I know that more than ever since I have been part of this church. We started coming to this church in 2002-2003. Now that is another story (a God Moment). My brother wanted us to look in Ocean Pines, but it was too expensive and it wasn't what Rob wanted. Rob didn't want to live his entire life where we were in Pa., so I took a map and pencil—if God wants us to move, we will move right here...I put the pencil down on the map and it landed on the Longneck area. I was looking to make him happy, and God showed me where he wanted us to be.

I was and still am a person that wants to help people and make them happy. God has used and blessed me more than I ever thought possible with a great church full of wonderful people who have become family– I love you all! I even went to Costa Rica on a mission trip. During the past 20 plus years, not only have I been a caregiver for a various number of people, but I have also been a Sunday School teacher, the director of AGAPE, and involved with the VBS program (directing and writing it). I never wrote a VBS program before, but God would wake me up from a sound sleep and told me what to type and I was able to put it together. At first, I felt very overwhelmed because of the voices in my head—Fruit of the Spirit, the 10 Commandments, Beatitudes, Armor of God, Parables, (Women of the Bible, Men of the Bible which I co -wrote with Shirley Stranz). I wasn't sure what I was supposed to do with all this, but the Holy Spirit led me and used me as his instrument. I also volunteer at the Boys and Girls club teaching the Growing Tree Pre-School bible stories and songs with the hope of Proverb 22:6 "Train up a child in the way he should go and even when he is old, he will not depart from it." The world is a scary place and hopefully these kids will carry these stories and songs with them. The seeds being planted now hopefully will grow and they will become followers of Jesus. \blacklozenge

When you notice problems, affirm there will be a timely solution and a gift from the problem.


When you resist feelings or thoughts, practice acceptance. When you feel discomfort, know it will pass. When you identify a want or need, tell yourself it will be met.

You might be holding your baby You might be holding a drink You might be holding a secret That's getting harder to keep


