
Ladies of this church, I would encourage you to get involved in the group and experience what God has for you. May you always have your eyes on the Son and be focused on what he has for you!

Message in a Bottle

"Many are the plans in a person's heart, but it is the Lord's purpose that prevails. Proverbs 19:21

Dennis Komsa was 12 years old in 1963 when he wrote a note, put it in a mason jar, and tossed in into the Atlantic Ocean. Fifty years later, Norman Stanton was visiting his sister in Seaside Heights, N.J. and found the jar on the beach while combing through the debris from Hurricane Sandy in 2012. When he opened the jar, it contained a note, a 1958 nickel, and an envelope with the return address where Dennis lived. The jar had only traveled about two-tenths of a mile from where Dennis had thrown it into the ocean.

The note Dennis had placed inside the jar was neatly printed in all capital letters: "TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN, PLEASE FILL OUT THE FOLLOWING QUESTIONS AND MAIL THEM TO ME. THIS IS A SCIENTIFIC EXPERIMENT BY DENNIS KOMSA, AGE 12. WHERE WAS THE JAR FOUND?, WHEN WAS IT FOUND?, HOW WAS IT FOUND?, and ANYTHING ELSE WHICH MIGHT HELP ME"

Dennis was 61 and living in Hillsborough, N.J. when the jar was found in 2013. He was surprised by the jar's discovery and said, "Things happen for a reason. I guess it's good it came to shore. It shows that anything is possible." But Sharon Roher, Norman Stanton's sister, said, "The jar was emotionally uplifting for me. I think it's nice to have something like that happen in the aftermath of the storm's chaos that left our community in a shambles. That jar carried a much bigger message for me—if a young boy can throw a bottle into the ocean and have it show up 50 years later in the same place, then Seaside can come back and be restored to a condition as good or better than it was."

This story reminds us that we, as Christians, know that our words have meaning and our actions have an impact. Things we do and say will likely have an impact on someone else—a friend, coworker, or family member—either right away or at some point in the future. The impact may be profound or subtle but nevertheless it carries the Lord's purpose. But what about the impact we make on others who we meet along the way? We may not realize it, but our words and actions set an example to people we encounter through our service to God and they take notice. The impression we leave behind could make a difference in someone's life. We are imperfect people doing our best as we make our journey through an imperfect

world. But what distinguishes us from the rest of the world? We have God's love and have been forgiven. We have been set free from our sin to walk the new life made possible by Christ Jesus. Therefore, we should have a strong desire to be a good example for other people to follow.

So, what kind of an example are you being to those you meet along the way on your journey? It has been said that we may be the only bible that some people will ever read. What is your life saying about the faith that you carry in your heart and profess? Can people see Christ in you?






September 6
