Response: The extent of existing and proposed easements has been shown. It is anticipated that additional easements my be required due to the complexity of the project. These easements will be reflected on all future final engineering plans and consultation plans.

4. The landscape and pervious calculations are incorrect, as they each add up to 100%, the indicating no impervious area is proposed.

Response: The open space calculations have been updated to be consistent with the suchitectural plans.

5. We recommend planting of Dwarf Podocarpus at 18" O.C., instead of the 2' O.C. specified.

Response: The Dwarf Podacarpus will be planted at closer spacing as requested.

6. Recommend providing more substantial trees/palms in and/or around the plaza located at the SE corner of the sight, for shade and visibility reasons.

Response: The applicant has made substantial revisions to the plaza. Shade trellis have been added to address the review comments. That being said, it is important to note that the applicant intends to utilize the plaza for large gatherings and special events. Trees have been carefully located to respond to the architecture while respecting the intended use.

Criteria ii - ...has an efficient pedestrian and vehicular traffic system, including pedestrian, bicycle and automotive linkages and proper means of ingress and egress to the streets;

The development will introduce ADA compliant sidewalks thru out the entire site and they will connect to all adjacent properties. Vehicular ingress/egress is provided by way of US Highway 1 and Donald Ross Road. Access easements will be granted in two different locations connecting to the adjacent Plaza de la Mer.

Criteria iii - ...has adequate provision for public services including but not limited to access for police, fire and solid waste collection;.

The site will be serviced by all public service entities including police, fire, solid waste collection, United States Postal Service, etc.. These services are available to each adjacent property. Provider letters from each referenced service will be submitted to the Town upon receipt.

Criteria iv - ... complies with the Adequate Public Facilities Ordinance regarding potable water, sanitary sewer, solid waste, drainage, recreation and open space, and road facilities;

As each adjacent property is fully developed and serviced by all public service facilities including sewer, water, electric, cable and telephone; this criteria will be satisfied. Service provider letters will be submitted to the Town for their record.

Criteria v. - ... is planned in accordance with natural characteristics of the land including but not limited to slope, elevation, drainage pattems (low areas shall be used for lakes or drainage easements), natural vegetation and habitats, and upique physical features;

This site is an infill site between four large commercial developments. The natural characteristics of the land have been taken into full account and the applicant plans to mitigate for any areas of sensitivity. Full Engineering plans addressing drainage have been provided to the Town for their review.

Criteria vi. - ... preserves environmental features and native vegetation to the maximum extent possible, and complies with the environmentally sensitive lands ordinance

The environmental features and native vegetation of the land have been taken into full account and the applicant plans to mitigate for any areas of sensitivity.

Criteria vii. - ...protects estuarine areas when concerning; marina siting, drainage plans, alteration of the shoreline, provisions for public access and other concerns related to water quality and habitat protection.

This requirement is not applicable in this specific instance as this property is not located near an estuarine area or shoreline.

The site is currently over parked by fifty-two (52) spaces. This underground structure will also serve as a stormwater management system.

The Architecture is in keeping with the "Old Florids" style and integrates significant horizontal elements and detailing which reduce the overall height of the buildings but adds variation and rhythm to the elevations. The architectural style is Florida vernacular and Bermuda with a combination of siding and stucco finish and elaborate detailing. Each unit will have a balcony and end units will have wrap-around balconies incorporated through each floor. The overall height to the fourth floor roof deck is 60 feet, a Florida Vacation" color palette has been incorporated to further add interest to the elevations from the street and the plazas. Each building has a roof-top patio for the use of the residential units. The patio's have a pool and lounging area that is accessible byof the residential stainway and elevator.

The four buildings are set up in a quad configuration which wrap around a large central plaza. The plaza area has been designed to compliment the buildings and add an amenity for the residents and patrons of the development. The design incorporates a large fountain element that allows for outdoor congregating. This is only one of the four plaza areas the applicant is proposing on site.

The other large plaza area is located at the southeast corner of on the site (US Highway 1 and Donald Ross). The applicant's vision is to have this plaza serve as the pedestrian entrance way into the project; a gateway into Juno's "Town Center". The plaza is proposed to have two large pergolas, over ten benches, a second water feature, and it will be heavily landscaped. Both public plazas will be treated with decorative stone finishes.

The Architecture is in keeping with the "Old Florida" style and integrates significant horizontal elements and detailing which reduce the overall height of the buildings but adds variation and rhythm to the elevations. The architectural style is Florida vernacular and Bermuda with a combination of siding and stucco finish and elaborate detailing. Each unit will have a balcony and end units will have wrap-around balconies incorporated through each floor. The overall height to the fourth floor roof deck is 60 feet, A "Florida Vacation" color palette has been incorporated to further add interest to the elevations from the street and the plazas. The overall design is to serve as a guideline for future development in this area. The architecture has been well sought after much discussion with the Town and is consistent with the "Old Florida" style that the Town wishes to see for this area. Criteria 3. - ... is representative of the "Old Florida" architectural style, such that elevator and stairwell shafts and other modern operations and features of a building shall be either completely concealed or embellished with architectural treatments and features to minimize large spans of flat surfaces or vertical elements; rooftop equipment and elevator and mechanical penthouse protrusions shall be concealed; entirely flat building walls without architectural features shall be eliminated or minimized; and parking garages and other accessory structures shall be designed with architectural features and treatments so that they are well proportioned and balanced and in keeping with the architectural style of the principal structure;

The building incorporates elevators fully concealed within the interior floor plate of each building. The garage entrances will be architecturally treated so as to provide visual interest at the entrance to each building. The development shall incorporate a pool, cabana, and a deck/gathering area for the residents on each building which will be treated with similar architectural detailing and treatments.

All plaza areas, arcades and accessory pool areas will incorporate the same lighting that will be utilized through out the site. All pedestrian amenities shall be consistent throughout the site in design, material and color.

Criteria 5. - ...shall have a design in which buildings over forty (40) feet in height shall appear more horizontal or nondirectional in proportion rather than vertical, accomplished by the use of architectural treatments as described in these criteria;

The building incorporates horizontal banding at each floor level and a low profile pitched roof to minimize the four (4) story appearance of these buildings. Additional elevation features and variations in the height and rhythm of the buildings also assist in the proportions of the buildings. The buildings measure sixty feet (60'-0") to the top of the fourth (4) floor.

Criteria 6 - ...shall locate and design mechanical equipment with architectural treatments so that any noise or other negative impact is minimized;

The development of the site will allow for the placement of the mechanical equipment on the roof of the buildings and away from the adjacent properties in order to minimize potential off-site impacts. Both effective landscaping and architectural treatments shall be utilized to buffer this equipment from on- and off-site views.

Criteria 7. - ...complies with the Town's Community Appearance Standards (see Section 5.200)

The Applicant shall incorporate all applicable elements of the Town's CZO Community Appearance Standards as prescribed in section 5.200. Brick pavers shall be incorporated into pedestrian sidewalks at entrances to units and at intersections. The applicant shall incorporate shade trees and palms, shrubs and groundcovers in compliance with the recommended plant list specified. A prominent street-edge will be incorporated into the overall design along U.S. Highway 1 and Donald Ross Road which includes such elements as hedges, garden walls, gates and pedestrian-scale lighting. The overall planting theme shall be tropical and include many native salt-resistant plants.
